Class R

Continuing with our Minibeast topic, Class R have been learning all about bees.

In maths, we have been looking at numbers beyond 10. We had a bee themed maths area where we used bees and pom poms to make teen numbers in the honeycomb. Class R enjoyed a game of what time is it Mr Wolf for some active learning and Mr Wolf tested us by shouting out 'teen' numbers.

In English, we enjoyed reading the story 'The Very Greedy Bee', this opened up lots of discussion about sharing and what makes us a kind friend, Class R had some lovely ideas. We have used our phonics knowledge to write facts about bees, practicing our handwriting skills. We also worked on our pencil control with some bee themed mazes.

We have been very creative this week, including making paper mache bees, using shapes to create a bee, bubble wrap printing and exploring our bee themed sensory tray. We also enjoyed some themed water play, including saving the flowers from the frozen bee hive.

We learnt how the bees collect the pollen and nectar and transfer it to the beehive. We then had ago at transferring our own nectar using pipettes.

We have been out in our outdoor area and scattered some wildflower seeds. We are looking forward to watching the flowers grow.

To finish the week we made some yummy honey sandwiches. Class R thought the honey tasted sweet and delicious.

Class 1

This week in English we have finished reading 'The Naughty Bus.' We completed a prediction track to show what might happen to the naughty bus as he got closer and closer to the pond.

We wrote sentences to describe how the bus felt after falling into the pond. We wrote about the naughty things the bus had done throughout the story and wrote questions that we would like to ask the bus.

In Maths we have been learning about multiplication and division. We have practised our doubles and sharing and grouping for division.

In Computing we have learnt about programming simple robots. We had fun using the beebots and programming them to follow a route.

In Science we went outside to find out what the most common wild flower was in the school grounds. We had differing results but overall the dandelions and the daisies were the winners. In PE we practised some skills commonly used in volleyball such as striking and volleying a large ball with some accuracy and learning how to dig a ball by getting underneath it. We enjoyed rallies with our partners and aiming for a hoop.

We had a great time at the Wacky Races to end our busy week!

Class 2

This week as part of our 'There and back' theme, we learned about space flight. We discovered that on 20th July 1969, something amazing happened that had never happened before, people landed on the moon! This was a very important moment in history and the start of space exploration. Three astronauts flew in a spaceship called Apollo 11. An astronaut called Neil Armstrong was the first person to step onto the moon. We also found out that technology invented for the Apollo space missions has helped develop useful items for everyday life including camera phones. We imagined being astronauts ourselves and pondered the question: What would we take into space? We had some great answers! Using the conjunctions and, but and because, we wrote sentences about each item explaining why we would take it. In Maths we have been identifying the 2-D shapes that make up the faces of 3-D shapes, including identifying pyramids according to the shape of their base. We moved onto exploring edges and vertices. As part of our science work with plants, we labelled the parts of a plant and found out the jobs each part does. We are checking our bean plants each day and have just seen the first shoots!!

Class 3

This week in maths, Class 3 have been learning about fractions. We have learnt about unit fractions and non-unit fractions, identifying, ordering and comparing them.

In English, we have continued with The BFG, answering questions, inferring meanings and putting speech into inverted commas. We used our dictionary skills to find correct meanings and the thesaurus to find words for ways of eating.

In science, we revisited muscles, looking more closely at how they work, following on from making our models last week.

We looked at changes in our lives in SMSC this week. Considering how they can affect us and make us feel, and how we can use different methods to help deal with these or make these feel better.

In computing, we continued with our Branch Diagrams, trying to generate our own questions to separate a group of dinosaurs.

In PE, we revised our triple jump skills then learnt some techniques for shot put and javelin.

Class 4

This week, Class 4 have continued our work looking at the story 'Witches' by Roald Dahl. We read the chapter 'The Grand High Witches' and wrote a diary entry imagining that a witch had paid us a visit.

In Maths, we have been looking at decimals on a place value chart, dividing decimals by 10 and converting fractions to decimals. The children have really engaged with this and explored tenths and hundredths.

In Science, we did an experiment which investigated the melting point of chocolate buttons. The children identified the independent, dependent and controlled variables of the experiment and used different temperatures of water to investigate.

In Computing, we moved on to our new unit: Digital Photography and editing. The children practiced rotating photos and cropping them to focus more on the subject of the photograph.

Finally in French, we completed learning about our hobbies and interests and we wrote a letter to a French girl all about ourselves.

Class 5

This week in Maths class 5 have started to look at coordinates, they have been able to identify the coordinates of a point and plot points using coordinates. In English we have started to read "the explorer" the children have used the story to write their own narratives about being stranded in the Amazon rainforest. In Theme we looked at features of rivers and were able to identify the source and mouth of rivers across the world. We have also started to look at the layers of the rainforest. In science we have looked at the length and mass of a baby as it grows. In PE the children have developed their communication skills and looked at how important it is to make sure you talk to your teammates during a football match.

Class 6

This week, in English, we've been writing from the perspective of an object, specifically a remote control. We've been considering its experiences and feelings in various daily situations, while striving to incorporate writing features.

During SMSC, we've been learning about self-care.

In PE, we've honed our rounders skills and familiarised ourselves with the basic rules of batting and fielding.

Additionally, we finished reading our class text, "The Girl of Ink and Stars," which was enjoyed by all the students. Through this text, we learned about the importance of friendship and the strength and power of these relationships when we need support.




