Class R

This week, Class R have continued learning the story 'What The Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. The children have loved using the small world resources to tell the story and writing what the characters said. One of activities was children pretending to be ladybirds around the classroom and listening to what their friends say. They then had to write down what their friend said and their friends name in a speech bubble. The children also had fun with the application Chatterpix on the iPads, where they could make photos of animals from the story speak.

In Maths, we have moved from doubling to sharing and grouping. The children had practiced this before, in the autumn term, but they really enjoyed practicing what remembered by having a teddy bear's picnic. We talked about how to share things equally and then the children were able to apply that knowledge to create equal groups. We have also looked at odd and even numbers. Why not ask your child to explain how they know which numbers are odd?

In PE, the children practiced listening skills with a fun game of Simon says. They then went on to practice balancing and had to adopt balances based on the PJ Mask characters.

Class 1

This week in English we have finished off our own versions of Lila and the secret of rain stories. We then started to collect suitable vocabulary to describe rain to help us write a chorus poem about rain. First we grouped our words into words describing gentle rain and words describing heavy rain to form our two verses. We then shared lots of ideas for our chorus. We had suggestions like splash,rain,splash and rain,rain, all around me. We selected our favourite and used this in writing our shared class poem.

In maths we have been learning about time. We looked at using the terms before and after correctly as well as using words to describe the time of day such as morning, afternoon and evening. We practised saying and ordering the days of the week and months of the year. We learnt about seconds, minutes and hours and considered which of these we would use for a particular activity. We decided that brushing our teeth would take minutes whereas a day at school would take hours. We also looked at telling the time to the hour using o'clock. In Theme we learnt about the Maasai Tribe in Kenya. We learnt about where and how they live, what is special in their culture and how life for their children is different to ours. We wrote facts about the Maasai tribe on our spider diagram. We also had a lovely day on Open Day completing some different maths activities!

Class 2

This week Class Two have been on a virtual safari finding out all about the Big Five. The term 'Big Five' is used to describe the buffalo, lion, leopard, elephant and rhinoceros found in Africa. First we researched the animals and made notes. We used the notes to create written fact files with labelled illustrations. Finally we completed an animal questionnaire using the information we had found out. We found out some fun facts....Did you know that a lion's roar is very loud and can be heard as far away as 8 km and a group of rhinos are called a crash! In Maths we had fun solving problems with family and friends on Open Day and we also worked on measuring mass using grams and kilograms using objects from around the classroom. Our estimates got better as we learned more. We used our 2, 5 and 10 times tables facts to help. Sadly this week we discovered that quite a few of our games and jigsaws were mixed up or had broken or missing pieces. We used this for a discussion on being responsible and respectful. We decided that we needed to be more responsible as a class so we worked hard together and had a productive afternoon sorting out and playing the games.









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Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been learning about Branch Diagrams in the Computing lesson. We also assessed past learning by producing a stop-motion animation about seed dispersal, after learning about the different methods as part of their science lesson. In maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shape. It was also lovely for Class 3 to share games and Maths problems with their visitors on Monday at our Open Day. Our PE lessons continued with athletic; throwing skills on Tuesday and relay skills with Chiara.

Class 4

Class 4 finished their book *Journey* this week and have set about planning their final "big write" of the year. We split the story into 7 events, and are drafting (and re-drafting) our own version, including direct speech, fronted adverbials and powerful adjectives. In maths we finished our unit on money and have moved onto time. We looked at time zones in theme and in SMSC we produced a leaflet with information about puberty. We created pan pipes in science and in computing we started editing pictures by cropping and rotating.

Class 5


In our English this week we reached the climax point in "The Boy With One Name". Jones and Ruby have decided to rescue his parents from a powerful witch. The children have enjoyed using the index at the back of the book to find out the old words! We have also began working on writing the rules for the maths Games we made up on Monday. In theme we have been investigating Mayan gods. We continued our PE with more on tennis in time for Wimbledon. WE also had a visit alongwith Year 6 from the local PCSO. Lastly we have been continuing our maths work on angles and calculating angles in shape as well as revising perimeter.

Class 6

This week in Class 6 we have continued to read the Class text
Wonder and have been introduced new characters and
continued to think about how Augist feels during these new
experiences he faces as he moves schools. We also had a visit
from our local PCSO who came in to discuss with us the dangers
of swimming in open water- which could become tempting as
we enter the summer holidays and anti-social behaviour. The
children joined in with some great discussions to understand
what was meant by anti-social behaviours and to be
consideration of people who live within their neighbourhood
during the summer holidays.
