#### **Class R**

Our focus book this week has been *Cinderella*. After reading and re-telling the story, the children have designed their own wands which they then used to play a magic phonics game. They have designed their own princess dress using a finger painting technique, and have used playdough to make some pretty patterns. They have practiced some pencil control with a palace-themed worksheet too.

The children have LOVED being in the outside area again this week. We finished off last week's *Three Little Pigs* text by making our own house, then adapted these to build our own palaces.

In maths we have explored mass and capacity. We have used scales to compare the weight of objects and tried to make our scales balance. We filled a variety of jugs too with cubes, pine cones and shells to compare capacity.

We also found time to read the book *Pantosaurus* and talked about making sensible choices.

#### Class 1

This week in English we have worked hard writing letters to an older relative. This was linked to our topic about 'Communication Then and Now' and we asked questions in our letters about what communication was like when our relatives were young. In Maths this week we have practised adding ones using number bonds to help us, finding and making number bonds to 20 and finding doubles of numbers up to 20.

In Science we have been learning about seasonal change from Autumn to Winter and have focused on the the weather. We have completed a weather chart to record the weather symbol, temperature, rainfall and wind speed and direction for each day of the week.

Our art was also linked to our Communication topic. We used clay to sculpt cartouches and carved our names in hieroglyphics. We will paint them next week when they are dry.

In Theme we walked through Diggle on a Communication hunt. We spotted telegraph poles with phone lines going to houses, telecommunication boxes, letter boxes, a telephone box, a post box and a post office. We then posted our letters and we are really looking forward to receiving some replies.

#### Class 2

In English this week we used our previous learning to write a 'Wanted' poster for Wolfie, one of our main class story characters. We learned what suffixes are and how to use them to add interest to our writing. In Maths we moved onto data and statistics working with tally charts, pictograms and bar charts. In theme this week we did lots of learning about our current theme, Communication: Then and Now. We found out how early writing used symbols rather than letters, such as Egyptian hieroglyphics and how early books were produced on a printing press. We had fun listening to, translating and writing our own morse code messages which were used to send telegrams. We learned how the science of sound helped Alexander Graham Bell invent the first telephone. We were amazed that some people were a little bit scared of the telephone because they didn't understand how it worked. We made string telephones to test how sound vibrations travel. We discovered that the sound of a person's voice is louder through the string than it is through the air over the same distance.














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#### Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been learning more about Roman soldiers and the army in theme. They are using their learning to plan a diary entry from the perspective of a Roman soldier which they will write next week.

In maths, we have been using our times table knowledge to solve division calculations. We have been busy setting up investigations in science, finding out if all surfaces reflect light and how shiny objects respond in the dark. We enjoyed our brass lesson this week with Mr Byers and are busy learning a song about the Romans ready for our Roman Variety Performance.

#### Class 4

This week, Class 4 have been learning about division in Maths. We have looked at 2 methods to help us - creating a place value table and using a Part Whole model. The children managed to divide 2 and 3 digit numbers by 1 number with both methods and then decided which one they liked best. In English, we have looked at the features of diaries. We explored some famous diary examples before writing our own practice diary entry. As a twist, our practice diary entry was written from the point of view of an inanimate object. Some of them were very funny - I felt sorry for the bell that was rung so many times it fainted!

In Theme, we have learnt about Boudicca and her rebellion against the Roman Army. We then pretended to be the Roman Army and created a wanted poster for Boudicca.

In Computing, we carried on with creating algorithms. The children were able to explore building different shapes with different instructions.

In PE, we built up our football skills, looking at defence and dribbling, and finally in Science, we learnt about teeth - why not ask your child to name the different teeth humans have?

#### Class 5

This week in Maths we have started our new topic on multiplying fractions. In English we have been looking at Greek myths, we have described mythical creatures and began to create some of our own. In SMSC the children have been learning about online safety. In PE we have started to come up with our own yoga routine, thinking about how we transition between poses.

#### Class 6


This week in English we have been focusing on Greek myths and have thought carefully about the similarities and differences between them. We have worked really hard to describe a mythical creature, thinking carefully about the writing elements they are choosing to use.

In maths we have continued to work on our algebra topic, where we have been forming expressions. Next week we will be moving on to solving one and two step problems. In SMSC we have looked at how retailers try to influence our spending by advertising products in certain ways to make it look like we are getting a better deal. We also looked at the impact of colours and layout of adverts and how this might impact us too.

All entries must be submitted by 29 February 2024.







#### Message from Martin Lewis, Money Saving Expert.

Last year, the government extended eligibility for bereavement support payment and widowed parent's allowance to **cohabiting** parents with dependent children. These benefits were previously only available to parents who were married or in a civil partnership.

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) says thousands of families could be eligible for a back payment, but they need to claim by Thursday 8 February 2024. If you're a parent whose partner died between 9 April 2001 and 8 February 2023, you could be eligible for backdated bereavement benefits worth thousands of pounds - even if you no longer have dependent children.

To apply online, fill in this Gov.uk form. It'll take around 15 minutes. Or if you'd prefer to apply over the phone call 0800 151 2012.
