We have completed some assessments in maths to see what we remember from last year and in English we have written some sentences about our Summer holidays. We still had some time for learning through play and have enjoyed using our new ice cream van role play area.





Class 2

We have all had a fantastic start to Year 2 this week with lots of responsible learning and a super effort with behaviour. We have spent the week working on activities using a book called 'Have you filled a bucket today?' We all have an 'invisible bucket' that holds our good thoughts and feelings. 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Class 3

What a busy week! Class 3 have had a fantastic start to the new school year and the juniors. We have introduced our new theme 'The Stone Age' looking at what we already know and things we would like to find out. We have begun our class text 'Stone Age Boy' making predictions and writing speech bubbles for the main characters and converting them into dialogue after acting out our scenes. In maths we have revised some Year 2 learning and been reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to 1000 and have investigated magnets in science. We even fit in basketball and a french lesson! Have a great weekend and a well earned rest.

Class 4

Class 4 started their week with a brand new music unit on Abba's 'Mamma Mia'. We started our Animals Including Humans science topic by sketching and labelling wild animals of Saddleworth. In theme we discussed what we know, and want to know, about the Stone Age. Negative numbers were the focus in maths as we practiced adding and subtracting either side of 0. After writing all about our families and our holidays, we studied the front cover of the new class text *Stone Age Boy* and made some predictions. We practiced throwing and catching in our dodgeball lesson on Friday, and also thought about how to show respect to our VIPs in SMSC. It's great to be back!

Class 5

This week in Class 5 we have based our written work in English around a short film called 'The Lighthouse' focusing carefully on the description of the main character and the setting; remembering to use expanded noun phrases and exciting adjectives. We have started to look at Mini Maths this week, looking at how to answer a range of arithmetic questions. In PSHE we have looked at what type of learner we are and how the different types help us all to learn in different ways.

Class 6

On the first day of school half of us got to meet our buddies to help them get lunch and to get use to the school. We did RE on Tuesday doing which natural disaster was prevented and which weren't.

On Wednesday we did French and learnt to say a poem in French and made are own birds for the poem. We also learnt how to say hello and bye also we learnt what our names are. School Dinners

We welcome **Mr Tillett** to the school as our new cook who has made some very tasty dinners this week. The school has taken over the running of the catering from Oldham Council, and over the next few weeks Mr Tillett be devising a tasty new menu. We are delighted Mrs Fox and Mrs Brennan have stayed with us, and they all look very smart in their new purple uniforms.



If your child currently has packed lunches but would like to try school dinners there is no commitment required, they can pick a day they would like to try from the menu (on the school website), and order it at registration. Meals are charged at £2.40 each for all children not eligible for Free School Meals in classes 3 - 6 and we ask that parents keep their school meal account in credit at all times via Parent Pay.

New Staff

We have welcomed three new members of staff this September. Miss Evans is our Reception Teacher, Miss Pickles is working in Class 6 and Mr Taylor is working in Class 1. Be sure to say hello if you see them around school.



PARKING

As we now don't have quite such a large stagger at the beginning and the end of the day, we ask that parents are extra vigilant in ensuring that they are parking in a **safe** and **respectful** manner.

Just a quick reminder of what we ask of parents.

It is part of the highway code that nobody stops or parks on the Zig Zags between the hours of 8am and 5pm Monday to Friday.

As a school we also ask that parents **do not double park on Sam Rd** to the right of the school. Double parking inevitably leads to cars mounting the pavement in order to leave enough space on the road. This makes the pavements very difficult to negotiate safely with prams and small children. It also leads to children trying to cross over to school having to do so between parked cars.

If we all work together we can ensure that our children are kept safe.

I know that some parents really support us in this and will speak up if they see cars parked in a way that goes against what we ask. Please can I ask that if it is pointed out to you that you are parking contrary to what has been asked of you, you accept with quiet dignity that you are in the wrong and do not verbally abuse the person that is speaking to you whether that be staff member or parent. Equally if you see a parking violation and want to bring it up keep your interaction polite and respectful.

In the end we all want the same thing: All the children to be safe.

Please ensure your child brings their instrument and music on the given day, and continue to encourage them in their regular practice at home.
