Welcome back I hope you all had a lovely half term. You should have all received a letter earlier in the week with regards to updated advice on testing from the local authority.

As you are probably aware the Delta variant is unfortunately on the rise in Greater Manchester. It is really important that you get a full PCR test for your child if they appear at all under the weather and that you as a family self-isolate until tha test result comes back. When booking the test you select the option that says "Your local authority has requested you get a test. I would dearly love to be able to get through this last half term without having to close a bubble. I believe we have the best chance of achieving this if we are all very vigilant with the PCR testing when unwell, plus regular lateral flow testing at home and then being very careful to keep to the social distancing guidelines when out and about and especially on the school premises.

Class R

This week Class R have settled back into school after the holiday. We started our new topic 'The Ocean'. The children have been talking about all the different creatures they know that live in the Ocean and we have been linking this back to our prior learning on habitats. The children have created colourful fish and jellyfish to decorate the classroom and we turning our role play area into a deep sea diving experience! In Maths, we have started learning how to count in 2s and investigated doubling and halving different quantities. In Phonics, we have practiced the set 3 sounds we learnt last half term. Finally, the children really enjoyed our CITC PE session and practiced lots of different ball skills.

Class 1

This week has been a computing week in Class 1. We have spent lots of time in the computer suite and have learnt to log in with our usernames and passwords, set our purple mash avatars and learnt about e-safety. We have learnt how the computer can be used to sort and group information and this has linked in with our maths work on 2D shapes. We have learnt how the computer can display or present information and we have made pictograms to show our favourite fruits and the numbers scored with 20 rolls of a dice. We have also learnt about coding and written some code of our own as well as fixing some problems with an existing code. In English we have worked on our writing from before half term, editing and improving it using our green pens. We have also learnt about the prefix un and using s and es to make plural nouns. We have also enjoyed a session with Jenny from RelaxKids where we learnt the 7 stages of relaxation.

Class 2

This week we have started our new theme work. We learned what a continent is, found Africa on a globe and then Kenya. We labelled important places on a map of Kenya and also found out about a day in the life of a little girl in Kenya, comparing it to ours. In our maths work we have worked practically to learn how making arrays can help us with multiplication and division. In English we have written our half term news and worked on 'up-levelling' our sentences. We all had a fantastic time working on outdoor Forest School and gardening activities with Mr Ryan. We even dug up our potatoes!

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Class 3

Class 3 have begun our new book 'Bewilderwood' this week. Before being introduced to the main character 'Swampy' who is a marsh Boggle, we thought about what a marsh Boggle would look like and sketched our ideas. Swampy loves to fish in the Fisher Grounds. We answered questions about him and developed a character profile, sketching Swampy. In maths, we have been securing mental addition and subtraction as well as working on formal addition and subtraction, all working at our own level and pace. In science we looked at how water is transported through a plant to the leaves. We made predictions and recorded our results and conclusion. Unfortunately, our natural food colouring didn't work so we had to watch a video to see what should have happened.

Class 4

Class 4 started their new science topic 'Sound' this week. We identified that all sounds are caused by vibrations, and we demonstrated this with some rice on top of a drum skin. Our English and theme topics have combined this half term - we began our new class text *Bewilderwood*. We thought about the character of Swampy, created a character profile and then built some amazing sentences to describe the bog where he lives. We then used the sketching pencils to draw Swampy. In maths we have recapped prior learning in a few assessments before going on to compare equivalent decimals and fractions. Finally, on Monday we had a really fun 'Relax Kids' session where the class took part in some breathing exercises, stretches and even massages!

Class 5

This week in Class 5 we have started our new theme 'The Mayans' looking at where the Mayan Civilisation originates from and which countries they may still be found in now. In Science we have started to look at animals and living things; focusing on the reproduction of plants. The children have also started to learn some basic first aid skills; this week we discussed why people might require first aid and then focused on what to do if someone had an asthma attack.

We have also continued to read the Class text 'The Nowhere Emporium.'

Class 6

This week in Class 6 we practised our play with Class 5 for the first time, but due to covid we had to do it outside. In maths we learnt algebra and we realised that we had done it before in the younger years of school. In English we carried on reading the book 'Wonder' and thought about how other people would see him and how his family see him. In PE we learnt athletics with Matt from the City and Community. The 3 skills we learnt were shot put throw, relay and under arm throws. On Monday in ICT we finished our coding based stories that we have been working on for two weeks!



Parking

Please can we remind parents not to park in the entrance to Heather Way, (the residential road opposite the school gates). Parking here makes it difficult for residents to access and leave the road. With the staggered start and finish times, there is plenty of parking space on both Sam Road and Huddersfield Road, as well as the carpark by the canal, so this area really shouldn't be needed by school parents as a parking area.

Please can we also ask that you do not sit for extended periods of time in your car parked on Sam Road as one of the benefits of the staggered start and finish times is there is plenty of room for all parents to park, but this only works where parents who have dropped off or collected their children then move on.




