

Class R

This week Class R have been carrying on with their topic 'Space'. We met an Alien named Glead and helped him explore his emotions by discussing how he might be feeling when he's alone and missing his parents from Space. We then helped him write a letter to his parents explaining how he feels and how we are going to help him. We also made our own aliens and spaceships so he was not on his own! We then started to look at stars, reading the story 'A star in a Jar'. We sang the song Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star, discussing how it is gentle and calm, this helped us choose the correct type of instruments and voices. Finally we all made a wish, and used chalk and a new rubbing technique to create star pictures.

In Maths, we have been focusing on our number bonds, we have introduced a score sheet in the classroom and a number bonds table where the children can try and beat their own score, the children got very competitive! We have also explored the numbers 11 and 12.

In RE we have been learning about Islam, remembering fun facts and then designed our own prayer mats. This week our word of the week is 'Shiny', we found things that are shiny, read the story 'How to Catch a Star' and wrote a sentence using our new word. In Phonics, we have introduced 3 new sounds, ea, Oi and split digraph ae, remembering they can not sit next to each other because they are to chatty!


Class 1

This week in English we have continued reading our class text the Naughty Bus. We have predicted what might happen next when the bus went into the garden. We have written sentences about how the bus was rescued from the pond and given our opinion about whether the bus will keep his promise. In Maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of halves and quarters. We have looked at shading a half and quarter of a shape and then found a half and a quarter of a number using cubes to help us. We have solved some problems about halves and quarters and enjoyed using the ipads to play some fractions games. In Theme we learnt about George Stephenson and his invention of the Rocket. We learnt about George's life and and how he came to the known as the father of the railways. In Science we have been monitoring our bean plants. Some of them are rather tall now! We also learnt about some common garden plants and designed a garden with our favourite flowers.

Class 2

This week our maths learning has focused on calculations, adding, subtracting and multiplying. We are trying hard to use what we know to check our calculations as we work and to use reasoning to think more carefully about how we can work something out. In English we have been working in groups using vocabulary linked to the Queen and her Jubilee. We have used the words to create interesting sentences, which we then put together into short oral stories. We made cartoon strips to show the story we had made. In SMSC work we have looked more closely at the 6R's especially responsibility. We listened to the story of the Frog and the Scorpion and had an interesting discussion about being responsible for our own actions. We worked with a partner to develop a poster to encourage people to be responsible and to show them different ways to do this. This week we have also made a start putting together our class dance for our Jubilee 'Dance through the Decades', we had a lot of fun!











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Class 3

This week in science, Class 3 have been looking at the effects of exercise on our bodies and learning how blood is transported around the body. We found our pulse and listened to our hearts using a stethoscope. We then did different exercises and took our pulse each time. In maths we have been adding and subtracting measures and using a decimal point. We have looked at language in the BFG and given him a grammar lesson! We have also looked at how we perceive someone from their appearance but that this is not always accurate. In art, we used our sketching skills to produce images of as sheep's skull, horn, and a conch among other shells.

Class 4

Class 4 produced some wonderful art this week. As well as decorating some jubilee bunting to be displayed across Oldham, we also used Andy Warhol as inspiration to produce some wonderful pop art Queen Elizabeth pieces. In maths we have counted up and down in hundredths and in SMSC we looked at reasons why people borrow money. For PE we worked on our javelin throwing skills and in English we continued to read Roald Dahl's *The Witches*. We experimented with batteries, wires and bulbs in science to make complete and incomplete circuits.

Class 5

In English this week we have been looking at the jobs and conditions which children during the Victorian period had to endure and have looked at the features and written a diary entry as a Victorian child. In Maths we have been converting different units of time. We have also taken part in forest school this week where we have created bug houses and we ended the week with a fire. We have also enjoyed swimming this week where some of us have been learning new strokes and other have been learning elements of their water safety test.

Class 6

This week class 6 have been doing SATS every morning. In the afternoons we have been going on Scratch and coding and animating characters. We have also been doing rounders in PE, playing outside and on Wednesday we did an activity in SMSC to do with Mental Health Awareness Week. During SMSC we also discussed what made us happy and who to go to if you were worried or have a problem. Also at the end of this week Class 6 have been to Grandpa Green's and enjoyed ice cream and in the park to celebrate the end of SATS!!!

Existing players will receive a separate letter to sign up for another year of music lessons from September.
