# <u>Class R</u>

Autumn animals has been the focus this week in Class R. We have created fox and hedgehog artwork using paint, crayons, playdough and even leaves. We have also watched videos about animal dens, and built our own animal dens using a variety of materials.

In Maths the children have looked at simple repeating patterns and identified what comes next. They have even had a go at making their own repeating patterns using autumn materials.

In phonics, we have looked at the sounds o, c, k and u. We have practiced writing them and using them in simple words. We are also getting better at blending different sounds to make simple words, like 'and' 'dog' 'tip' and 'pan'.

We have also read the books I'm not cute, It was a cold dark night and The very helpful hedgehog

# <u>Class 1</u>

This week in English we have carried on with our writing work based on the Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch. We have designed and described our own seagull stopping invention, written words to describe Hamish the cat, written an explanation of what a lighthouse is for and written a list of the foods we don't like. In Maths we have continued our work on addition and subtraction. We have worked on our number bonds to and within 10. We have practised adding together and adding more. We have also solved simple addition problems using practical apparatus. In Science we have learnt about our sense of hearing. We went on a sound hunt around school and grouped the sounds we heard into categories such as people, machines, instruments, weather and animals. We also took part in a sounds quiz where we listened to a range of sounds and tried to identify what they were.

We had fun in P.E. playing movement and agility games such as the Mr Men game, mouse holes and dodgeball. We finished the week by enjoying our Penny Wars prize of a movie with treats! Thank you FODS!

# Class 2

In our English lessons, Year 2 have been writing daily news. We listed some of the everyday things we do at school, such as the daily mile, lunchtimes and play times and then explored them in more detail. This helped us develop better vocabulary and sentence starters, check our secure spellings and share ideas for super sentences. Spelling focussed on the long vowel sound oa and its alternatives ow and o-e. In theme we enjoyed finding out about the seaside holiday resort of St Ives. Some of us had been here on holiday so already had some things to share. We looked for it on a map using a compass rose to help find the south west of England. We discovered lots of different things that tourists can do when they visit. We also learned some of the human and physical features found there such as cliffs, harbour and headland. We compared Diggle and St Ives and their similarities and differences. In Maths we have continued to compare objects and numbers using the language of "greater than", "less than" and "equal to" as well as the inequality symbols. We have also done activities to help counting in steps of 2, 5, 10 and 3. We had fun in P.E. putting the throwing and catching skills together to play different games.

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## Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been using their place value knowledge in Maths to add 1s, 10s and 100s. They have looked at related patterns and have now moved on to crossing the columns which is proving more tricky when using a numberline! In English, we have been collecting sentences and phrases for different parts of our narrative about an earthquake. We have drawn on our theme learning to create images for the reader and worked on short sentences to create suspense. We will be putting it all together next week. In science, we have learned how soil is made and then linked this to how fossils are formed. We have been looking at what various digital devices can do for us in ICT and practising different greetings in French.

# Class 4

This week, Class 4 have moved onto addition and subtraction for Maths and using our place value knowledge to help carry and borrow one's. In Theme, we have being learning about Tsunami's and this has combined with our English work of creating a narrative story. The children have started to draft their narrative stories using some of our poetry tools to help build up settings and characters. In Science, we have experimented with sound and distance. The children made predictions about what happens to sound waves as we move away from a sound source.

In art, we had a go at graphic art with pens and using 'The great Wave' by Hokusai as inspiration.

Finally in French, we talked about our pets and looked at masculine and feminine words.

# <u>Class 5</u>




# Class 6



## **School Meals**

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

## **Music Lessons**

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence. office to enquire about availability and financial commitment.


# **School Band Rehearsal Dates**
