

Class R

We have had another lovely week in Reception, despite the weather being a little wetter. We have focussed on the word 'emotions' this week. We talked about our different feelings and the types of things that make us happy, sad, angry and scared. We read the books, If you're happy and you know it, I have feelings, How do you feel, and I'm not scared. We also tried some yoga which the children loved. Miss Leach and I have been very busy completing the baseline assessments with the children, which they have all now completed. The children are still getting used to all of the rules and expectations and are really impressing us. They are getting really good at putting their hands up when they want to speak, and are becoming more independent, especially in the dinner hall. They have really impressed their buddies and their teachers. Well done!

Class 1

This week in English we have been reading the story of the Rainbow Fish. We talked about how the rainbow fish was behaving and how it made the other fish feel. We also discussed how the rainbow fish felt differently once he started being kind to others. We completed a carousel of activities over the week including writing a description of the rainbow fish, designing some rainbow scales, a pencil control activity and labelling the picture. In Maths we have been continuing our learning about place value within 10. We have learnt to represent numbers with objects, recognise numbers as words, count on from any number within 10, find one more and count backwards. In Science we had fun learning some body part names by drawing around a friend and then labelling the body parts. In Theme we started our new topic 'Beside the Seaside'. We looked at a map of the uk and identified the coast line. We then circled the places on the map with a seaside location. In PE we enjoyed playing some movement games. We played cat and mouse, traffic jam and dinosaur eggs to help us practise changing speed and direction, using fine motor skills and working as a team.

Class 2

This week we have enjoyed reading the story of 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch', and have used it for our writing activities. We have looked at different types of sentences and used the story to help us write statements, questions and exclamations. We have also focused on neat handwriting. Spelling this week has recapped the ay graphemes and kn and gn in words. In maths we have explored the place value of numbers. We have done lots of counting in tens and ones and partitioned numbers into tens and ones. We used tens grids and charts to help. We started our science topic of Habitats this week. We looked at what animals and people need in their habitats and drew our own habitats, making sure they had food, water, space to grow and move, and shelter to keep warm. We also decided a toilet was quite important to us too! We investigated the plants and animals we would find in a woodland habitat and also what the living conditions would be like for them. We discovered it was cool and shady with lots of trees. We also discovered some oak trees and acorns on our school field. Perhaps if we plant them we might grow our own oak tree.











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Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been learning about volcanoes in theme, ready for writing our Non-chronological reports next week in English. We also zoomed in on pictures of volcanoes for art, using colour, line and shade.

In maths, we have been using Base Ten for numbers to 1000 in place value.

We began our science topic 'Rocks' by grouping different rocks using different criteria.

We had our first lesson with Chiara on Friday, looking at scanning or space, dodging and defending.

Class 4

This week Year 4 have been learning all about Earthquakes, linked to out theme 'What makes the Earth angry?'. The children were particularly interested due to the tragedy in Morocco. The children particularly enjoyed completing an Earthquake drill.

In Maths, we have been exploring numbers to 1000 and beyond. Including; partitioning, representing, using number lines and rounding.

In English we have explored non-chronological reports and looked at formal vs informal language, opinion vs fact and fronted adverbials.

The children did particularly well in French this week - writing in the 'Tout Sur Moi' booklets.

In PE, we carried on with our invasion games and learnt how to dodge.

Class 5

This week in Maths Class 5 have been focusing on place value with numbers up to 1,000,000. We have been using place value grids to find 10/100/1,000/10,000/100,000 more or less than. In English we have been focusing on retelling the first chapter of Beowulf and retelling the story from Beowulf's point of view in the form of a diary entry. Ensuring that the language we are using is relevant to the text. In French class 5 learned the song "two little birds" and have focused on greetings.

Class 6

This week in maths we have been focusing on place value with numbers up to 10,000,000; thinking carefully about the value of columns, looking carefully at whole-part models to see how numbers can be represented and also looked at how numbers can be represented on a numberline. In English we have started to read our whole class text 'Beowulf' and have invited people of the town to the opening of the grand meadhall for King Hrothgar and also take on the role of new reporters to report 'live' on the devastating news that has occurred at Heorot overnight! In Computing we have discussed the importance of internet safety and have created posters to share with children around school so that they can follow the simple rules.

Next week is Week 2. The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

It's time to look at our amazing local heritage

SADDLEWORTH AND Oldham's fascinating history and heritage will be celebrated at a number of events in September. This year's Oldham Histories Festival and Heritage Open Days run from September 3-23 and offer a great chance to find out more about local people, places, buildings and stories. From talks to walks there's plenty to discover, whether you're interested in architecture or heritage or just curious about the history around you.

At Oldham Local Studies and Archives residents can discover the rich history of Oldham and its people, with archives dating back to 1597 and covering an enormous range of subjects.

Town centre highlights include an Oldham Town Centre Walk, Oldhamers and the Battle of Somme, a Photograph Open Day, notable Oldham figures, The 'Revival' Exhibition, and The Transformation of the Old Town Hall.

In Saddleworth, Heights Chapel above Delph will be open on Sat 10 Sept and Sun 11 Sept from 1pm-4pm, with refreshments available. Visitors can find out the chapel's history and see a display of original stencils used in its decoration, and on the Sunday there is a Songs of Praise service starting at 3pm.

Also in Delph, there will be guided tours of the site that was once a Roman fort on the Chester to York military road. Tours include findings from the latest excavations in 2014. Meet in the car park outside the Castleshaw Outdoor Centre, Waterworks Road, Delph, OL3 5LZ. No dogs allowed. Thu 8 Sept, 1.30-3pm; Sat 10 and Sun 11 Sept, 2-3.30pm.

Holy Trinity Church, Dobcross, will open its doors on Thu 8, Fri 9, Sat 10 and Sun 11 Sept, from 10am-4pm. Built in 1787, the Grade II listed 'Pennine Auditory' Chapel contains fine examples of original box-pews. Booklets with guides available at certain times.

In Lees, Grade II* listed Gothic church St. Thomas' is open on Sat 10 Sept from 10am-4pm so visitors can see the new community room and facilities, or enjoy tours of the bell tower (10am-12noon).

St. Anne's Church at Lydgate is holding open days on Sun 4, 11 and 18 Sept from 2.30-4.30pm, showing church history booklets and registers, plus maps and suggested walks around the graveyards.

And the historic St. Chad's Church in Uppermill will be open on Fri 9 and Sat 10 Sept from 10am-4pm and Sun 11 Sept from 1-5pm. Find out about the long history at the current Grade II* listed building through Parish Registers, tours of the bellringing room, children's activities and more.
