#### Class R

What a wonderful final week to the half-term in Class R. We enjoyed Pancake Day on Tuesday by eating them all up. Some of the children had golden syrup, some had maple syrup and others had lemon juice. Some had all 3!!!

In maths we have continued to work with the numbers 6, 7 and 8. We practiced subitising (telling what a number is without counting) by playing dice games like snakes and ladders. We also talked about the concept of odds and evens using egg boxes. We then looked at doubling. The children had great fun playing dominoes. This game is excellent for subitising and for spotting doubles!

We really enjoyed Valentine's Day on Tuesday by writing words to our loved ones. We made cards too.

The science activities have been wonderful this week. We made rockets on Monday with a real scientist, we went inside the wonderdome on Wednesday to explore space, and we dressed up as scientists for Friday's extra-special Break The Rules!

#### Class 1

We have really enjoyed our Science week! We had a visit from a scientist called Luke who talked to us about energy and how we can see or hear when energy is transferred. We had great fun creating explosions with bicarbonate of soda and lemon juice! We then made paper straw rockets where our breath provided the energy to launch our rocket!

We loved visiting the WonderDome planetarium and found out so many exciting facts about Earth and Space. At the end of of session in the dome lots of us said we would like to visit the moon one day! We ended Science Week with our experiments move around. In groups we moved to different rooms where we carried out exciting experiments like static butterflies, erupting volcano, germs and soap, blowing up balloons using baking soda with vinegar and dinosaur footprints!

In English we have completed our retell of the Beegu story and using our imaginations to write an alternative ending to the story. In maths we have completed our unit on addition and subtraction, learning about related facts and missing number problems. We also completed an assessment on Place value within 20.

In Theme we learnt about Alexander Graham Bell and how he invented the telephone. We were interested to find out that he became interested in sound by working as a teacher for deaf children. We are looking forward to our half term holiday, have a great week

## Class 2

It was our school science week and Class 2 had a fantastic time! We had fun working on lots of different experiments including 'kitten rescue' where we measured temperatures, making a dinosaur fossil, blowing up balloons with vinegar and baking soda and even making an erupting volcano wow! We were amazed with the WonderDome planetarium which took us on an adventure exploring the wonders of the Universe. It may even have inspired one or two future space explorers....We also found time to work on developing our descriptive writing skills with some super sentences to describe a woodland setting and writing a recount. Our spelling focus was to practise those key spellings which we are not quite secure with. We finished designing some colourful postal stamps as part of our Communication display. In maths we began work on our 2, 5 and 10 times tables with lots of counting and practical work. Finally we had 'Break the rules' day on Friday which saw lots of rules being broken. We have worked hard this half term and are looking forward to our half term holiday. Have a lovely week everyone!

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#### Class 3

What a wonderful finish to the term with Science week. The Wonderdome was amazing and it was lovely to visit the different planets and especially the moon! The children enjoyed the fireworks science on Monday and have had great fun moving round the different experiments on Friday, learning more about the different areas of science. The costumes were amazing and we really had a broad spectrum representing a variety of science fields.

This week we have also been busy in DT, designing, making and evaluating our Roman shields. The children worked hard to produce them and considered changes and improvements along the way. We look forward to taking some of our finished shields with us on our march over to Castleshaw on 22nd March when we hope to reproduce some Roman army formations whilst visiting the Roman site.

#### Class 4

This week has been Science week! The children enjoyed learning about fireworks on Monday, staring up at the stars on Wednesday in the Wonderdome and finally doing lots of different experiments with different members of staff on Friday. In Class, our lessons have had a DT focus, while we have created our own Roman shields. On Monday the children designed and wrote instructions on how they would create their shields. They had to use what they could remember from our literacy lessons on instructional writing e.g. time conjunctions and imperative verbs. Later in the week they then had the chance to build their shields, and the final products are looking amazing!! In Maths, we have continued looking at length and perimeter and particularly length and perimeter of rectilinear shapes. Why not ask your child to define 'rectilinear'?

#### Class 5

This week class 5 have started their new topic in Maths - decimals and percentages. We have started to look at equivalent decimals and fractions. In English the children have been writing their own independent Greek Myths. In PE the children have had their final yoga lesson, we have also created our own positive mantras and/or meditations. We have also taken part in science week where the children have had a look at what it's like to be different types of scientists.

#### Class 6

This week in Class 6 we have written our own independent Greek myths, where we have created our own mythical creature to feature in the story and have worked hard to include all of the writing elements. In Maths we have tried to catch up with the Decimals topic, finding the specific value of particular columns and looking at how to multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.


As well as the exciting Science week activities we have also continued with our science topic of Evolution and Inheritance and have looked at fossils and compared their similarities and differences to the closest living species now. In some of the example we were able to see subtle changes into how they have adapted and evolved over millions of years.



On Monday, Luke the Scientist came into school and showed us how fireworks get their different colours, how to make a paper straw rocket, how to measure temperatures to keep a kitten warm and how to make a cast of a footprint to see if we could match the shoe to the print - (like real crime scene investigators).



On Wednesday the hall was filled with the Wonderdome, which is an amazing indoor planetarium. The children loved learning about how planets are formed and what the future holds for space exploration.

Finally, today the children have tried lots of different experiments. In KS1 they have learnt about static butterflies, an erupting volcano, germs and soap, blowing up balloons using baking soda with vinegar and dinosaur footprints, and in KS2 they have learnt about the density of liquids, chromatography, optical illusions and using ultraviolet light to reveal hidden messages.

Over the next few pages you'll see some of the wonderful things the children have been up to. A big thank you to Mrs Rawson for doing all the organising in school and to FODS for providing the funding. The children have all said how much they have enjoyed it.




























































































The special theme of the competition this year is 'Being Part of a Group'.

There is still time to enter this fantastic competition. All entries must be submitted by 29 February 2024.




