#### **Class R**

This week has been an unusual week for Class R due to our bubble closure. The children have reacted very calmly to this change, demonstrating all the resilience they have developed over the year. The children have been completing some wellbeing activities as part of their home learning and before the bubble closure, the children were sharing details of their favourite holidays with each other, as we began to look at the sea side and summer holidays. Mrs Bradbury and Miss Leach are so proud of everyone in Class R for the amount of progress they have made while in Reception and we are looking forward to our online Google Meet classroom on Monday! Don't forget your party hats!

#### Class 1

This week in Maths we have been learning about time. We have recognised o'clock and half past times and drawn the hands on a clock to show these. We have also counted on in hours to work out the time duration from o'clock to o'clock. In English we have been completing our English summer revision booklets to revisit lots of the key skills taught this year. In Theme we had fun creating our own Maasai collar necklaces using paper plates, pipe cleaners and beads. We thought carefully about the pattern we wanted to make and made sure to choose bright colours.

#### Class 2

This week in our English lessons, Year 2 have learned how to use conjunctions to make compound sentences and give reasons. We also did some 'housekeeping' in our English books checking and reviewing the work we had done this year. We looked at how our work had improved throughout the year, we were especially proud of our progress with spelling and joined handwriting! In Maths we have continued problem solving. This week we worked on a challenge to make totals using different numbers and combinations, it sounds easy but it proved a little tricky.... we were resilient. To finish our African theme work we designed and made necklaces just like the Maasai tribes wear. Isaac had brought one to show us and explain about it. We used brightly coloured beads and collage materials, we also looked at African patterns and continued repeating patterns which we made sure were brightly coloured. In our last Lifestyles lesson we made fruit pancakes with sauce and honey, yum!

#### Class 5



#### Self isolation is still a requirement

As you have all no doubt heard the rules on self isolation will be changing in the future with this in mind the Local Authority has asked us as headteachers to reiterate the following message to our parents.

As you will be aware, there will be changes to how contacts are managed that start **no sooner** than August 16th.

Until those changes happen, all close contacts of confirmed cases of COVID-19 do still need to isolate in line with the current guidance. After that, close contacts who are aged under 18, or who have received both doses of the vaccination, will not have to isolate and will instead need to have a PCR test. All confirmed cases will still need to isolate for ten days.

I am more than aware that self isolation is difficult especially with young children however please can I stress the importance of you ensuring that if you or your child is identified as having to self isolate, for example if a class bubble closes, it is imperative that you adhere to the rules and ensure that the person who is required to isolate does not leave the house and is not in contact with anyone from outside your household.

Case numbers in Oldham are currently the worst in Greater Manchester and it is only by everyone doing their duty and following the rules that we are going to reduce these numbers.
