<u>Class R</u> In Reception, this week we have continued with our Literacy book 'Aliens Love Underpants' by Claire Freedman. We wrote our own alien stories and there were a lot of very imaginative stories. Why not ask your child about their alien story and what their alien stole? In Maths, we were looking at positional language and programmed Bee-bots to help us explore space. We have started Commando Joes and dance in PE. The children demonstrated creativity and great problem solving in both of these activities. Finally, in Phonics, we moved onto Set 2 sounds. This week we learnt; ay, ee, igh and red word; her.

<u>Class 1</u> In Class 1 this week we have continued to read the Beegu story and have worked on writing a letter to her telling her about ourselves and describing how we could be a good friend to her. In Maths we have been learning about mass/weight. We have estimated and weighed using balance scales and used the vocabulary heavier and lighter. We have also weighed objects in grams and even weighed ourselves in kg. In Theme we have been learning about messenger pigeons and how they were used particularly in WW1. We have done some observational drawings of our own pigeons and written a help message to be taken by a pigeon.

<u>Class 2</u> In Class 2 this week we have been learning more about how Messenger pigeons were used. We have written messages which can be attached to a pigeon, watched videos to show how they were used in the war and drawn sketches of pigeons. Even our homework is about pigeons! In Maths we have been learning how to tell the time to quarter past and quarter to. We also learned about the Queen and what she does ready for our first Commando Joe mission.

<u>Class 3</u> This week Class 3 have continued our book 'Escape from Pompeii', following the character Tranio. We learnt to play the game Knucklebones (Jacks) from the Roman times and wrote instructions for them. We then researched Roman theatres to produce a non-fiction piece of writing. In maths we have been learning about fractions; finding, shading and ordering them in relation to shapes. We followed this up in ICT with a number of activities. We enjoyed our Forest School session; working in groups to produce an animal from sticks and stones.

<u>Class 4</u> We have started our new class book Escape from Pompeii in English this week. We have analysed the main character Tranio, taken notes about Roman life, and written instructions on how to play the game jacks, or knucklebones. In maths we have been comparing equivalent fractions. In science we explored gasses, and learned about the great scientist Joseph Priestley.

<u>Class 5</u> This week in Class 5, in English we have looked at the story of King Midas; we have retold the myth in a storyboard and have written our own alternative endings; thinking carefully about features which we need to include and also what else the King could have wished for. In Maths we have looked at rounding and using the rules across a range from the nearest 1 decimal place to the nearest 100,000. In Theme we looked at the Greek democracy system and how the Ancient Greeks made decisions.

<u>Class 6</u> This week in English, we have looked at the myth of King Midas. We have created our own comic strip version of the myth. We also created a character profile of King Midas and thought about ways in which he could be a more considerate man. We re-wrote the end of the myth changing the wish he made. In maths, we have spent time consolidating our knowledge from previous weeks as well as some assessment work. In theme, we have we looked at how democracy began and compared Ancient Greek democracy with democracy in the UK today. In science, we have begun to look at the Linnaean system of classification.

Commando Joes

KS1 and Early Years started their Commando Joes sessions this week. Year 2 worked on preparing for their first mission, which has a royal theme. They have been researching the queen and her guards; particularly, who the queen is, what she does and what the guards roles are in protecting her.

In Reception, the first mission was linked to their topic; Space. The children had to work as a team to create a star shape, using just their bodies. All the children showed great teamwork, listening and creative thinking skills.

Pigeon Club

On Wednesday pigeon club had visitors from a production company called Venom Productions who are interested in filming our work with the pigeons. We showed them the pigeon loft and then bathed some pigeons ready for the RPRA show at Blackpool this weekend.
