## ) HEADTEACHER'S COMMENTS >

As you know, in the past we have always only administered prescribed medication in school. However, in order to help out working parents and improve attendance, we are making a change to our policy.

In future if your child is well enough to come to school in a morning because you have given them a dose of something like Calpol but you know they will take a dive once this starts to wear off, we are now going to give this kind of medication once a day in school. The medication must be labelled on both the bottle and the box with your

child's full name. You must also complete a medication form and then bring the medication and form to the school office. Please do not pass it through to adults on the door in the morning as it is the office staff who give the medication and they need to speak to you. If your child attends club you may give it to a member of club staff. Please note we can only give one dose of any medication in the day.

#### <u>Class R</u>

We have had loads of fun in Reception this week learning all about Diwali. We watched a video and learnt about what Hindus do to celebrate 'The Festival of Lights'.

We used coffee and water to make a browne paste. We then painted this onto our hands and arms to make some beautiful mehndi patterns.

We used food colouring to dye some rice which we then used to make rangoli patterns. We also mixed condensed milk with coconut and food colouring and made some delicious Diwali snacks called 'ladoos'.

After learning that Hindus light candles (called 'Diwas') in their houses to celebrate the special day, we made our own diwa lamps out of modelling clay. We had to use our fine motor skills to squish the clay and use our fingers and thumbs to shape it. We then decorated them with paint and glitter.

In phonics we learnt the sounds j, v, y and w and in maths we identified circles and triangle by counting the sides. We also made some "Kandinski art" using circles and triangles as a template.

Finally, we learnt our parts for the Christmas play and started to sing some of the songs.

## <u>Class 1</u>

This week in Maths we have completed our work on addition and subtraction and started to learn about 3D shapes. We explored the 3D shapes to help us learn their names then we used a feely bag to see if we could guess the shape based on what we could feel. We also followed instructions to build different trains that contained certain numbers of specific 3D shapes.

In English we have continued to read our class text 'Lost and Found'. We read that the boy and the penguin were going to row to the South Pole. We talked about what they might want to take with them on their long journey and why. We wrote our ideas in full sentences focusing on capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We also wrote our ideas about what we would take on a long journey and discussed the idea of something sentimental. In Science this week we learnt about the different animal groups such as mammals, reptiles, birds, fish and amphibians. We sorted pictures of a variety of animals into the correct groups. In Theme we have learnt about the climate in the Arctic and the differences between an Arctic Summer and Arctic Winter. In Art we have painted our backgrounds for our winter display work ready for printing next lesson.

## Class 2

This week in Maths we have been adding to the nearest multiple of ten and subtracting from a multiple of ten. We have also been looking for patterns as we have worked.

In writing we have been retelling the story of The Storm Whale in our own words. We tried to include lots of the writing features that we have learnt in year two.

Class two have started a new Science topic called 'Animals, Including Humans'. We have sorted pictures of creatures into the categories of mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish. Some creatures were easy to sort, others much more difficult. We also found out what a life cycle was and learnt about the life cycle of a hen.

#### Class 3

This week in maths, Class 3 have been adding and subtracting across 10s and 100s using exchanges. We have used pictorial representation and apparatus when needed.

In English, we have been reading and writing instructions using adverbs and command verbs.

We practised chest passes in basketball, combining these with past skills to carry out activities and selecting the appropriate skills for the games. We produced some amazing cave drawings of animals in theme, blending and using our shading skills, building up from previous sketching lessons. We are all taking turns on our 'cave wall' to see what

it would have been like drawing on the walls. We have started a new Computing Unit 'Creating Media- Stop frame animation' and enjoyed making our own mini animations using a flip book.

## Class 4

This week, Class 4 have been describing a stone age cave setting. They have practiced building up sentences and we have pushed even harder to use our interesting adjectives and other devices for description. In Maths, we have learnt about calculating the area of a 2D shape by counting squares. We have also being practicing our times tables. In Science, we looked at the 9 life processes with 'Mrs Gren'. This sparked a lively debate in our class about robots and AI and if they were alive. We looked at some forms of AI and the children checked off which life processes they thought current AI has.

In PE, our focus is still gymnastics and this week we looked at different kinds of rolls. This built on our last lesson by making sure we prepare to set off into a roll properly and finish in the correct position. Finally, the children loved layering sound and editing sound in our computing lesson. We also chose team names, rolls and topics for our Christmas podcasts.

#### Class 5

This week in Maths class 5 have been converting fractions in order to find equivalent, greater and smaller fractions. In English we have been researching individuals that were on the Titanic. We used this information to write biographies about our chosen people. In science the children have been looking at different forces such as buoyancy and air resistance. In PE the children have been practicing defending and maintaining possession of a ball.

#### Class 6

In English this week we have been researching passengers from the Titanic to write biographies about them. We have really tried to take care to read the information and make notes on the important parts, before then writing this in our own words. In Maths this week we have started our

fractions topic, learning how to order and compare fractions by changing the numerators or the denominators depending on their common factors. In Science we have finished writing up our Science experiments to see which surfaces within school had microorganisms on them which them developed into mould. In Theme we have started to look at the Industrial Revolution and learn about what it was and the impact it had, as well as looking at countries within the British Empire at this time. #### **School Meals**

The menu for school dinners is on the school website https://www.diggleschool.co.uk/school-meals

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

#### **Music Lessons**

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence. We are pleased to announce that the school now has its own defibrillator machine. This has been sent to us by the government for school use.

However, as you know, at Diggle we feel we are an integral part of the community so are happy to offer the use of the defibrillator machine to the wider Diggle community.

If there should be an emergency, please come to school and we will pass you the defibrillator.

Unfortunately, the government has not supplied us with a weatherproof external mounted box which means the defibrillator will need to be kept inside school, so will only be accessible during school hours.

Although this is not ideal, we hope that, if the worst happens, and the school is open, we can be of help.

We'd like to remind you that there are also two other defibrillators in the village, one at Diggle Day Nursery and one at Kilngreen Church.

We believe this is because the pop-up adverts are aimed at the registered user of the account. So if you are a 35 year old adult, who is letting your child access their social media account, your child could be seeing adverts suitable for a 35 year old adult. This may well include graphic content.

We cannot stress enough that you should not be letting your child access ANY social media channels. For your reference the minimum age restrictions are given below.

The website you are purchasing from was only launched days/ weeks ago? **STOP - THIS COULD BE FRAUD** 

You're asked to pay by bank transfer instead of using the online platform's secure payment options. STOP - THIS COULD BE FRAUD

A sense of urgency is placed on ordering the product or service so that you don't miss the price/deal. STOP - THIS COULD BE FRAUD

You receive a fake email receipt/invoice that appears to be from the website you've purchased from or the payment service used to make your purchase. The email address domain doesn't match that of the genuine senders. STOP - THIS COULD BE FRAUD
