### <u>Class R</u>

This week Class R have worked hard in Literacy, learning all about Valentines day. We discovered that St.Valentine came from Italy and shared our findings with each other, it was very interesting. We then learnt about what happens when we add heat to chocolate, finding out that it melts. With this melted chocolate we made fruit and marshmallow skewers to celebrate Valentine's day. We read the story 'I love you Little Mouse' and made cards using the phrase 'I love you to the moon and back' which is used in the book. We have also had an introduction to rhyming words this week, spotting them in the story 'Stop Telling Fibs'. We then made silly soup only using words that rhyme. In Maths, we have been using paint to demonstrate our knowledge of capacity, using vocabulary

such as 'full, empty, nearly empty and half full'. We have also been consolidating our knowledge of subitising up to 5 using dice, we are now super! In Phonics, we have recapped our previous set 2 sounds and red words. We have also been focusing on red word 'you' and introduced 'was'. In PE, we have practiced balancing on one leg ensuring that we can control our balance. Class R's word of the week is 'unhappy' we practiced showing an unhappy face, discussed when we might be unhappy and when the teachers might be unhappy. Some of us then wrote a sentence with

the word included and drew a picture. Finally, we have practiced our listening skills by playing carpet games, we had to listen to the instructions carefully, listen to each other's voices and remember what has been said.

### Class 1

This week in English we have completed our retelling of the Beegu story. We worked really hard to build our stamina for writing and tried hard to remember our sentence basics such as capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In Maths we have been learning to add and subtract numbers to 20 without using additional apparatus. We concentrated on holding the biggest number in our head and then using our fingers to count on. We

moved on to using a number line to subtract a 2 digit number from a 2 digit number.

In Theme we learnt about Tim Berners-Lee and his invention of the World Wide Web. We talked about how the web helps the world to communicate better. We used the ipads to access the world wide web to find out three facts about our chosen topic of interest. In Science we learnt about animals in winter and how they adapted to survive. We learnt about animals which hibernate, animals which migrate and animals who adapt by changing their bodies or behaviour.

### Class 2

This week Class 2 have finished our science work by finding out about the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (we all need water, food and air). We also made a start on designing homes for animals to live in making sure they had everything they needed. Our phonics has focused on words which end with el including towel, hazel, vowel and squirrel. We used these words in our handwriting practise and to ask and answer questions. In maths work this week we have been doing learning checks to find out what we are good at and what we still need to work on. This included how we add and subtract 2 digit numbers, use a tally chart, pictogram and block diagram and whether we can tell the time to o'clock, half-past, quarter past and quarter to. We all tried hard. We discovered that time is the area we still need to practise. Our investigations into number patterns this week have continued to focus on ways to make the number nine. This week we using the greater than and less than asigns and also played a true or false game. We had a busy afternoon on Thursday using the i-pads for research as we decided to make our own books. Some of the things we choose as topics were the rainforest, amazing animals, colour, football and even ice-cream!

In English this week we have read the book Orion and the Dark and had a go at a variety of comprehension activities. We have revisited multiplication in maths while in science we looked at reflective materials and thought about which jobs rely on these as part of their uniform. We wrote letters in theme, imagining we were a Roman soldier in Britain and in PE we had another great yoga session. Well done for all your hard work without Mrs Spencer again this week.

### Class 4

Class 4 have rewritten *Escape from Pompeii* in English this week. We have included conjunctions, prepositions, direct speech and fronted adverbials when writing in first person. In maths we have got to grips with the bus-stop method of division and in science we made a booklet of everything we have learnt in our *States of Matter* unit. In SMSC we looked at forming good habits and in theme we learnt about Hadrian's wall.

### Class 5


This week in Class 5 in Maths we have been reflecting shapes across four quadrants and have been recapping the properties of different 2D shapes; looking at the numbers of sides and angles and if they have parallel lines etc. In English we have been writing our own version of the poem 'The Jabberwocky' by Lewis Carroll and have performed them in front of each other. In Science we have been investigating how different mixtures can be separated using different techniques; magnetic attraction, sieving, evaporation and filtration

#### <u>Class 6</u>

In English we have been writing our own version of the poem 'The Jabberwocky' by Lewis Carroll and have performed them in front of each other.

In Science we have looked at advantages and disadvantages of adaptations during evolution, particularly thinking carefully about why some changes might not always benefit the species. In Maths we have been using coordinates; reading and writing them correctly across all four quadrants.

Please note, this day is **not** a general non uniform day. It is either a book character costume or school uniform.


We look forward to sharing and hearing about all the books the children bring in, and discussing their chosen word as part of the Word Aware programme in school.


