Class R

Goldilocks and the Three Bears has been our story of the week in Class R. We have read the traditional tale, watched Mr Tumble tell the story and even seen the ballet version on BBC iPlayer.

The children have loved our messy tuff tray full of porridge oats, cups and spoons. In the pop-up theatre we have enjoyed playing with Goldilocks and the bears to retell the story. The children have also thought about their own traditional tales and designed a front cover. Some of the children also considered some characters and a storyline. We have ordered the Goldilocks story by cutting and sticking images, and have grouped objects into small, medium and large. Our post office is still serving lots of customers and the children are enjoying writing letters to people, weighing packages and sticking stamps. In maths we have focused on the number 0 and learnt how to find, subitise and represent it.

We also welcomed some pupils-of-the-future on Wednesday's *Stay and Play*.

Class 1

This week in English we have read the first few pages of our class text 'Beegu.' We have written predictions about what Beegu might do after her spaceship crashed. We wrote thought bubbles for Beegu and the rabbits to show what they might be thinking when Beegu tried to talk to them. We wrote sentences about what sounds Beegu might hear coming from the city and wrote captions to go with pictures showing what happened when she tried to talk to the man.

In Maths we have been continuing our learning about place value within 20. We have practised 1 more and one less within 20, we have placed missing numbers on the number line, we looked at number lines with different start and end numbers and estimated where numbers would go on an blank number line.

In Theme we continued with our topic about Communication Then and Now. We learnt about William Caxton and how he introduced the printing press to England in 1476. We were shocked to learn that before this many people could not read because books were only available to the wealthy. In PE we are learning about Gymnastics and we practised spins on different body parts and asymmetrical balances before putting these in a routine.

Class 2

This week we used our new class story, 'Fee Fi Fo Fum', to help us learn about apostrophes for possession. We looked at the characters from the story and wrote about them using the apostrophes in our work. We were also very excited to receive a letter from Wolfie! He asked for our help in trying to make amends for what he had done and how he could be a kinder wolf. One of our suggestions was to do some nice things for Little Red Riding Hood and her Grandmother to make up for scaring them. In Maths we continued our work with money. We counted and compared money all the way from one pence to £50. We also worked hard on an addition and subtraction assessment. This week, we also explored what IT is and where it is used. We looked at school, our homes, shops and the wider world. We were amazed to see how much we use IT everyday, for work, to talk to people, to play and to buy things. During our P.E. lesson we worked on travelling with a ball. We learned skills to change direction, control the ball with our feet and how to dodge an opponent in a game. Finally, we really enjoyed the snow and the opportunity to play out in It too!









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Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been reading about Julius Caesar and collecting facts for writing his biography. In science, we have been investigating how shadows change when the object or light source is moved. It was tricky to record the results at first but we showed resilience and got there in the end! Class 3 were then set the challenge of investigating how footballers at a night match can have 4 shadows. Their learning showed as they worked in groups to complete this.

In maths, we have been working in different groups to further and consolidate our knowledge of multiplication.

Class 4

This week in Class 4, we have being practicing writing biographies. The children chose a famous or historical person to do a practice biography - using their knowledge of features from last week. They then self evaluated their biographies and used the feedback to help them improve for their biography of Julius Caesar. In theme, the children have researched Caesar and plotted the growth of the Roman Empire on a map. In maths, the children have learnt about multiplying and dividing with 10 and 100. They were able to apply their knowledge of place value to help them.

In Science, the children have moved onto a new topic - animals including humans. Some of our teachers and teaching assistants were blown away by their knowledge of the human digestive system and we are looking forward to learning more over the next few weeks. In computing, we have also started a new unit -

programming. The children were able to program a turtle to draw different numbers using programming language.

Finally, in PE we have continued with our football skills - looking at different dribbling techniques. The children practiced using different parts of the foot to move the ball and introduced dropping their shoulders to fool defenders, which we learnt during our invasion games unit.

Class 5

In Maths this week class 5 have been multiplying 3 and 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers. We have also been solving problems involving multiplication. In English we have been busy writing our submissions for the DLP writing competition. In theme we have investigated the conquest of Alexander the Great. In PE we have been doing Yoga, we learned some yoga poses and talked about which muscles we were using.

Class 6

This week in English we have continued to focus on different aspects of SPAG specifically looking at how to write in note form and how to use commas, colons and semicolons in lists confidently. We have also started to plan and write using a chosen stimulus for a DLP writing competition. In SMSC we have looked at what biodiversity is and how we can change things in our lives to have a positive impact on our world. In maths we have continued to learn about ratio and looking carefully about the relationship between numbers and how we can use this to help us when answering different questions. In theme this week we have looked at the Greek Gods and learned about some of them in more detail.







