Class R

We have had a fabulous first week back of the summer term. We started our brand new topic of *Minibeasts*. The classroom is full of books about small critters, and the old reading area is now a 'minibeast investigation lab'.

The children have got back into the swing of things by completing counting and colouring minibeast sheets. They have also been practising their pencil control with some more minibeast-themed activities. The playdough has also been out and the children have made their own bugs.

We have read the books *The Very Ugly Bug, Mad About Minibeasts* and *Beetles*. We have also watched a few episodes of *Teeny Tiny Creatures* which looked at earwigs and craneflies.

In maths we have been identifying 3D shapes. The children can spot pyramids, cuboids, spheres, cubes, cones and cylinders. We used paint to see how a 3D shape is made up of different 2D shapes.

Class 1

This week we began our new transport topic 'There and Back.'
In English our linked text for this half term is 'The Naughty Bus.' We began reading and looked in particular at the way the writers have arranged the text and punctuation on each page and discussed what effect this has on the readers. We made predictions about what adventures the bus might get up to, to earn him his name. We also wrote about where the bus works and what the clues were. We wrote thought bubbles for the people at the bus stop who the bus drove straight past. In Science we looked at what plants need to grow well and planted some cress seeds on cotton wool.

In Theme we started to learn about how transport has changed over time. We found out about a very early form of transport called a sedan chair which was first used in China over 4000 years ago. We also looked at the differences between older and more modern versions of each vehicle.

In Maths we completed assessments for length & height and mass & volume before we started our new block of work on Multiplication and Division. We have practised counting in 2s, 5's and 10's. In PE we started our unit about net and wall games. We had fun practising attacking and defending in game called steal the treasure. We worked in pairs to rehearse our throwing and catching skills and then played a game of cage dodgeball.

Class 2

This week we started a new 'There and Back' theme about transport. We discovered there are many different types of transport that we use now, but it was a bit different in the past. We learned how people's lives were very different before they had cars, planes or trains. We investigated steam trains and had a 'virtual' train ride where we found out what it is like to travel on a steam train and how the locomotive worked by using coal to heat a fire to boil water to make steam to make the train go! We researched George Stephenson the inventor of one of the earliest steam locomotives. We imagined we were on the first ever journey and wrote about our experiences. We looked at how steam trains changed and compared what it was like to be the fireman or a first class passenger on the train. In Maths we have been working with 2D and 3D shapes, investigating the properties of these shapes including edges, faces and vertices. We drew 2D shapes and sorted them using different criteria. We enjoyed our first PE session of the term with CITC.

Class 3

This week we have started our new theme which is text based. We are going to be doing lots of work around the book The BFG by Roald Dahl. We have already read 3 chapters, answering questions from the text and looking at different suffixes and spelling rules. We have inferred from the text to draw a picture of the view from Sophie's window using the descriptions to help us.

In maths, we have continued with measures, looking at different scales for mass, adding and subtracting and have now moved on to capacity and volume.

In Computing, we have continued with Branching Databases, formulating questions to

separate a variety of items.

We have considered mindfulness and wellbeing in SMSC, focussing on having a positive attitude to help our mental health and how we can make this happen. We enjoyed meeting our new CITC coaches today for an athletic lesson where we developed our running techniques.

Class 4

This week in maths, we have finished off our unit on Fractions. We have recapped last terms learning and looked at how to add and subtract with improper fractions and with mixed numbers.

In Literacy, we have started our text based theme which is 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl. We have read the first 2 chapters and discussed what TV, films and stories have taught us about witches - pulling some great vocabulary like 'grotesque'. We have also written a non-chronological report on Norway as this is where the text is set. In Literacy, we have also been developing our Spelling and Punctuation knowledge by learning the rules around plurals. Why not ask your child the rule for when to add 'ves''?

In Science, we have moved onto a new topic: States of Matter. The children learnt about features of Solids, Liquids and Gasses. We also looked at the different particles of each state and acted them out.

In French, we learnt how to discuss our favourite sports and took a survey of which sports our friends preferred by asking the question 'Quel est ton sport prefere?'.

Class 5

This week in English class 5 have looked at lots of different SPAG features, we have focused mostly on how to use commas and the effects using a comma has on sentence structure. In Maths we have started our new topic on Shape. We have started to look at measuring and classifying angles. In Theme we have started to look at South America and the Amazon Rainforest, we discussed what we already knew about South America and labelled the different countries within it on a map using an atlas to help. In Science we finished our topic on animals and their habitats and compared life cycles of different animals.

Class 6

This week we have continued to read The Girl of Ink and Stars and have made predictions about what we think might happen to Isabella as she continues on her perilous adventure to save her friend. We have also spent some time discussing the text to ensure we all understand what has happened so far. In Maths we have been looking at how to measure angles and also calculating missing angles within a straight line and a triangle. In Science we have started our new topic, animals including humans, where we have closely looked at the heart muscle and have started to understand the idea of oxygenated and deoxygenated blood within our blood vessels.

Last term, the nine schools in the Dovestone Learning Partnership held a writing competition which was open to all children in Years 5, 6 and 7.


The children were given a picture, or a piece of music, or a sculpture, which they had to write a story or poem about. The work of three children from each school was then shortlisted to be entered into the final.




