Class R

This week Class R have started a new story, 'The Three Little Pigs.' In Literacy we have been comparing the similarities between The Three Little Pigs and Goldilocks and the Three Bears, discussing the different materials and their uses and we even made our own dream homes. We have built our role play area with the Three Little Pigs houses. In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 5 and practicing our counting to 10. We have played the game, What time is it Mr Wolf? We then played this inside using pig and wolf figures, making sure we counted the steps correctly. In Phonics, we have consolidated our learning with previous sounds and started to learn a new digraph 'sh'. In RE, we have been acting out friendship, focusing on bible stories. In PE, we have been practicing our spacial awareness, pretending to be cars and avoiding each other and cones. Finally, we celebrated Children in Need! We had a colour run and had our own Strictly Come Dancing competition.

Class 1

This week in English we have read more of our lost and found story. We completed our Penguin fact files and wrote about how we might travel to the South Pole. We thought about what we might pack in our suitcases and we have written about what story we would tell the penguin on the long journey. We have also written about how the little boy and the penguin might have felt on the journey. In Maths we have been practising our counting in 5s and 2s. We were able to find five more and two more than any number and could count in both 5s and 2s to 100. In Science we have been investigating our sense of taste. We tasted lemon, dolly mixtures, salted crisps and dark chocolate to decide which one tasted sweet, sour, salty or bitter. In PE we continued with our Gymnastics from last week. We practised a log roll, egg roll and a forward roll.

Class 2

In our science lessons Class 2 have been finding out all about Charles Macintosh who invented a waterproof raincoat - we have been grateful for them this week!

In our maths work we have continued learning about place value in 2 digit numbers. We have partitioned numbers, made our own numbers from single digits and learned how to order numbers using greater and less than signs. We have also continued to use the tens and ones apparatus and work with money.

We continued our story called 'Ten Little Lights'. We learned how to ask and write questions using question words to start our sentences and a question mark at the end.

In RE we have learned about the mosque as a place of worship and the items we may find in a mosque.

In PE we have continued to work on ball skills, throwing and receiving correctly.

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Class 3

This week we have been learning about volcanoes in theme; naming parts, learning how they are formed and locating volcanoes in an atlas before plotting them on a map. Children created Fact Files and wrote a story poem about a volcano using poetry features we had studied in English. In maths, we have recapped formal multiplication and division and some of us have moved on to solving word problems involving these. In art we investigated colour mixing with watercolour paints to produce lava colours for our volcano sheet.

Class 4

In maths this week, Class 4 have studied perimeter,, and learnt that this is the outside length of shape. We also had two assessments on geometry and multiplication. In science we had great fun looking at the types and functions of human teeth. After labelling a diagram we then made a model using clay. In SMSC we focussed on feelings and emotions and in PE we continued our teamwork and communication skills by creating obstacle courses that we had to complete. We also had a really fun "volcano day" on Wednesday where we labelled diagrams, produced some lovely artwork and creating some detailed fact files.

Class 5

This week in Maths we have carried on looking at factors and have also learnt about prime numbers and prime factor trees; some of us have struggled with this but have shown great resilience to continue working on it. In English we have written letters where we have tried to write in a similar style to Stanley and exaggerate the positive things about being at Camp Green Lake so that his mum doesn't worry. In Theme we have created some pencil sketches of different African animals; thinking carefully about the shading which we use.

Class 6

This week in science we have dissected hearts to help us understand more about the circulatory system; we managed to find blood vessels, the ventricles, the atriums, the aorta and some valves. We also made a start on creating our own game based on the circulatory system. In maths this week we have worked on fractions. We have been converting and ordering them as well as finding fractions of amounts. In English we have read more of our class novel 'Holes'. From this we wrote letters as Stanley back home. We have started painting some African landscapes in theme.



These leaves will be displayed on trees painted on the walls of the school hall. This will be known as our "word wood."


IDLE FREE ZONE TURN ENGINE OFF
