Class R

Class R finished off their autumn theme with a focus on owls this week. We watched videos all about owls, we re-read the book *Owl Babies* and we practised some handwriting by drawing around an owl picture. We also worked on our cutting skills by using scissors to make our own owl image.

The pop-up theatre was brought out this week and the children had great fun re-telling the *Owl Babies* story. The children added to this, and even made up their own stories using different animal characters.

On Wednesday we were visited by Danny from *Curious Critters* who brought in a variety of animals. The children loved hearing all about his collection, and some were even brave enough to hold and stroke his animals. We were especially impressed with his owl!

To finish off our wonderful Wednesday, we had great fun designing cupcakes using chocolate frosting, smarties and different coloured chocolate buttons. Our owl cakes looked delicious and we found it difficult not to eat them straight away.

We also had time to design and make some feeders for the birds who may struggle to eat when the cold weather comes. We used lard, digestive biscuits and seed-mix to make our 'fat balls'.

Finally, the children had great fun celebrating their first ever Diggle School 'Break the Rules' day. The outfits were amazing, and the giddiness was (as you can imagine) crazy.

Class 1

This week in English we have been writing instructions. We worked in pairs to make a jam sandwich and enjoyed eating it too! We then wrote a set of instructions about how to make the jam sandwich and used time connectives such as first, then, after that and finally.

In Maths we have been completing some assessments on place value within 10. We all did a great job! We also completed some consolidation work on number bonds to 10 and one more/one less with a Halloween theme.

In Theme we learnt about St Ives and looked at both the human and physical features before designing a poster to persuade visitors to come to St Ives. We also learnt about the small islands that surround and are part of the UK. We named all of these on a map.

In Science we had a fantastic visit from Curious Critters! Danny brought some amazing animals and told us lots about their body parts and how they are suited to their habitat. We really enjoyed holding or touching some of the animals. We held both the Giant African millipede and the Leopard Gecko. We ended the week with a really fun break the rules day!

Class 2

In Maths this week we have started a new topic about addition and subtraction. In our first lesson we recapped the pairs of numbers which together make 10 and solved some problems using these facts. This week we have also had fun learning some new Maths games which will help us to practise place value.

In Theme we finished the Beside the Seaside topic. We enjoyed plotting a route on a map of St Ives from a campsite to a tourist attraction. On our maps we used symbols in a key and labelled a compass rose.

In writing we continued to practise our punctuation skills and looked carefully at the size of our letters in relation to each other to try and make our handwriting as neat as can be.

On Wednesday Curious Critters visited school. The visit linked to our Science topic about animals and their habitats. We could observe and feel a variety of different creatures and found out about what they ate. In Art we took inspiration from the White Faced African owl and painted owl eyes which will be displayed in the classroom.

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Class 3

This week in English, Class 3 have been looking back at their learning from last week to plan and write a first hand narrative based on an earthquake in Japan. In Maths, we have been crossing over the 10s and 100s when adding and subtracting, using number lines and apparatus to help us understand how and why the place value columns change. In science we have tested the hardness of rocks after making our predictions and we enjoyed our Halloween Break the Rules Day- thank you FODS!

Class 4

This week, Class 4 had an exhibition to show off our wonderful theme work, including setting off some active volcano projects. They were all wonderful. In maths, we have continued our learning of addition and subtraction, carrying and borrowing. The children have also applied their knowledge to a spooky Halloween maths mystery!

In English, we finished our narrative Tsunami stories and in science, we finished our work on sound by looking at how sound travels through the ear.

We really enjoyed our FODS break the rules day and starting our Halloween mechanical poster decorations for DT.

We also performed the song we have being learning in music, with Mrs Hawes, in assembly this week!! It sounded ace even though lots of us were nervous.

Class 5

This week class 5 have been working really hard in maths, we have been looking at prime numbers and square numbers. In Theme we looked at the kings that ruled over Anglo-Saxon Britain and how they eventually lost power to the Normans. In science we investigated moon phases and the moon's orbit around Earth. In art we looked at shading and shadows and how we can use them to make our artwork look more realistic. We have also started a DT project where we are designing spooky phone cases.

Class 6

This week in English we have read through and analysed the nonsense poem the 'Jabberwocky.' The children worked really hard to show an understanding of the poem and what story it was trying to tell. The children then worked in groups to imitate the poem and come up with their own portmanteau (nonsense) words to replace the words in the poem; thinking carefully about the number of syllables used in the words they have chosen. In maths we have started to recap using the bus stop method for short division and also dividing using other factors.

We have finished off out theme for this half term and have brought out learning together by looking at crime and punishment during the Anglo -Saxon and Viking period and also the impact on the last Anglo-Saxon Kings.

Curious Critters

This week Class R, Class 1 and Class 2 enjoyed a wonderful visit from Danny who brought lots of his curious critters. We met a Giant African millipede, a Leopard gecko, a Royal python, a Skinny Pig, a Madagascan lesser tenrec, a beautiful White faced Owl named Maddie and a Chilean rose tarantula.

We found out many amazing facts such as the tenrec goes through torpor which is a type of hibernation where the tenrec sleeps for several weeks at a time but then wakes to drink and toilet before going back to sleep again. We also found out that they are a distant cousin to the elephant!

They can swim and they are good tree climbers!

School Meals

The menu for school dinners is on the school website - https://www.diggleschool.co.uk/school-meals

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

Music Lessons

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence.
