Class R

We've had a very busy time in Class R this week! To prepare for the wonderful winter display, we have produced a wonderful collection of prints. We used handprints in green paint to make a tree and footprints in white paint for a great effect. We used a fingerprint technique with oranges and browns to design squirrels and hedgehogs and then thought of wintery words to go alongside them. We also used a snowflake template to finish the scene off!

We had a marvellous time on Wednesday afternoon welcoming some new friends to our classroom. The 'Stay and Play' was very popular and lots of our new visitors (and their adults) enjoyed exploring our classroom and getting stuck into the fun activities.

In between all of these activities we found time to talk about St Andrew's Day. We watched how people celebrate the special day in Scotland and enjoyed a lovely taster session of Scottish food (courtesy of Miss Leach's mum!). Top marks for the Tunnock's tea cakes. Class 1

This week in English we have finished reading our class text 'Lost and Found.' We have completed a prediction ladder to show what has happened in the story so far and written a prediction about what we thought might happen next. We then completed a story map by cutting and sticking images from the story and placing them in order. We learnt about time adverbials and how to use these to start our sentences and show when something happened. We wrote our sentences using time adverbials based on events from the story. In Maths we have finished off our learning about 2D and 3D shapes and completed some assessments about addition and subtraction. Later this week we worked on finding the eight facts in a fact family using our knowledge of parts and wholes. In Theme we learnt about the animals that are found in the Arctic. We used a map of the arctic circle countries to find out which animals were found in each country.

We spent a lot of time this week finishing our art work for the christmas displays and hoop. We have used everyday objects to print our winter images. We used 3D shapes, potatoes, bubble wrap, cotton buds and fingers. We also enjoyed hanging baubles on the school christmas tree and welcoming our class Elf who we named Mario!

Class 2

This week class two have started a new theme topic about the Arctic. We found the Arctic circle and the seven countries and their flags within the Arctic circle.

We have been working extremely hard in maths adding and subtracting multiples of ten to and from two digit numbers.

In writing we have copied our stormy sea poems in our neatest handwriting to be displayed on the wall with our stormy sea pictures. To create our sea pictures we colour mixed dark blue with white and printed snowflakes. They look really good in the corridor displayed with the poems. We have also started to practise the poems we will be reciting in the Christmas presentation.

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Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been producing a page on Stone Age Food, after researching last week. As part of this, we looked at how they used to stew berries with nuts then made a similar meal using porridge oats instead of nuts to thicken it. In Computing, we have developed our Stop Motion animations using storyboards and adding backgrounds and characters to tell a story. We have been using complements to 100 in maths and focussing on past learning with our Flashbacks. We used all the skills we have learned this term in our basketball session and looked at water and rail safety alongside a focus on road safety in SMSC as it is Road Safety Week. Throughout this busy week, the children have also been painting and printing winter scenes for the corridor. Where did we find the time? Our visit to Creswell Crags was amazing and all of Class 3 showed they had learned a lot as well as proving they would have been able to survive the Stone Age with their hunting and hut building skills!

Class 4

This week, we have been focusing on multiplication and division in Maths. Particularly looking at multiples of 3, 6 and 9. In English we have finished writing our instructions on 'How to catch a Woolly Mammoth'. In Theme we learnt lots of facts from researching how the Stone Age people hunted, this was really useful on our trip to Creswell Crags. At Creswell Crags, the children got a chance to develop hunting and survival skills, and explore the bones and fossils of real Stone Age animals. In, PE we started to look at cartwheels and how to use our bodies to create momentum.

In computing we continued with our Christmas podcast planning and were able to record some sound effects ready for editing.

Finally, in science we have continued looking at how to group animals and used our previous knowledge of Venn diagrams to display our animal groups.

Class 5

In class 5 this week we have learned about the features of a newspaper. The children have written newspaper articles to inform others about the events of the Titanic. In Maths we have been looking at subtracting

Class 6

This week in maths we have continued to work with fractions, looking specifically at multiplying and dividing a fraction by an integer. In English we have learnt more facts about the Titanic and have learnt about the features of a newspaper article and have then planned and written our own newspaper article about the events of the Titanic disaster in 1912. In Theme we have learnt about the Industrial Revolution and the factors which led to these huge changes during this period of time. In computing we have started to use the programme Tinkercad to learn about 3D design and how we can use 3D shapes to create different objects.

A huge thank you to Mr Dickinson, who kindly donated our stunning Christmas tree. Mr Dickinson works at the beautiful RHS Bridgewater.







School Meals

The menu for school dinners is on the school website - https://www.diggleschool.co.uk/school-meals

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

Music Lessons

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence.

SNAPCHAT - 13 years of age. THREADS - 12 years of age.

DISCORD - 13 years of age. X (TWITTER) - 13 years of age.

You receive a fake email receipt/invoice that appears to be from the website you've purchased from or the payment service used to make your purchase. The email address domain doesn't match that of the genuine senders.
