Class R

This week in Class R we have been super busy! In Maths, we have been practicing forming numbers with our magic fingers as well as organising pumpkins into size order. In Phonics we have been recapping set 1 sounds and our blending. In RE, we have been discussing our special places at home and why they are special. We then started to discuss our special places in school. After this, we started to look at different religions and their special places. We have celebrated Halloween in multiple ways this week in Class R, we started with making pumpkin lanterns and pulling funny faces what we might use. After this, we have decorated cookies, made pumpkins, sweets and bats with playdough and danced to spooky music.

Class 1

This week has been computing week in Class 1. We have used the ipads to learn about e-safety such as keeping our passwords secure and using an avatar instead of photo of ourselves. We have also learnt how to log in and log out of Purple Mash which is the platform for our computing scheme of work. We have explored how to use Purple Mash including saving and opening our work and how to see the teachers comments. We have learnt how to add pictures and text to a document and how to add data to a pictogram. In Science we learnt about the sense of touch. We used a feely box to put our hands in with and without a sock covering our hand to see how it affected our sense of touch. We then used feely bags in our groups to see if we could use touch alone to identify and describe the feel of the objects. In Theme we learnt about the story of Grace Darling and her heroic rescue at sea over 200 years ago. We ordered events from her life on a timeline. We had a great break the rules day and really enjoyed seeing each others costumes. We had fun reading the story a Magical Muddle and enjoyed writing potions of our own. We also made spooky paper chain decorations and used playdough to make a range of halloween themed items.

Class 2

Class 2 have been busy with Science this week. We have been learning all about everyday materials, their properties and uses. We found out that everything is made up of different materials. When we want to make something we need to choose the best material for the job. The property of a material is something about it that we can measure, see or feel and helps us decide whether or not it is the best material. We enjoyed finding out about wood, metal, glass and paper. These materials have more than one property. We learned lots of good vocabulary including strong, weak, heavy, light, rough, smooth, shiny, dull, hard, soft, flexible, transparent, opaque, elastic. In our maths work this week we have continued to focus on shape. We have worked with 3D shapes, counting the sides, vertices and edges.

Our phonics this week has focussed on ea and ee, ie and igh, oy and oi and ir and ur. We are getting better at using the phonics we know to read and spell. We had a fantastic day breaking all the rules on Thursday...have a look at our facebook post for some pictures!

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Class 3

This week, Class 3 enjoyed some Forest School activities; creating Woolly Mammoths and Woolly Rhinos on the ground, tracking each other and creating pictures with mud and crushed leaves. We learnt about The Iron Age and enjoyed sharing our homework projects. In maths we have been learning how to do column addition and subtraction. Break the Rules day was great fun with jokes and fantastic costumes..thank you FODS ©

Class 4

This week in English we have written Halloween Acrostic Poems. We made sure to include lots of descriptive language. We had a challenging maths lesson where we had to solve the mystery of the missing Halloween pumpkins by answering maths questions which would reveal the identity of the person who had taken the pumpkins. In theme we learnt about The Iron Age and designed our own warriors. We discussed Environmental Dangers in our science lesson and used the iPads to research endangered species and completed a fact file about our chosen animal. The children enjoyed forest school where they produced a cave painting. We have all really enjoyed Break the Rules Day. Thank you FODS.

Class 5

This week in class 5 we have continued with calculating the area of different shapes, moving on to irregular shapes where the children had to use their estimating skills when counting part of squares that the shapes take up. In English we have looked at using dashes and commas to show parenthesis in our writing, understanding that they can be used like brackets to provide us with extra information. In Theme we have looked at Viking runes and wrote messages for others to decode using these and also looked at everyday life for a Viking; learning about the gods they believed in, food they ate and clothing that they wore.

Class 6


This week in class 6 we have been calculating missing angles in triangles, quadrilaterals and on a straight line in maths. We did a SPAG assessment in English. In science, we have finished our experiment with the mouldy bread to find out what conditions mould grows fastest - we had to make conclusions from our findings. Also, we went to the duck pond (our local area) behind Diggle Day Nursery to look for organisms which live in Diggle, to classify. On the last day of this term (today/Thursday) we had another break the rules day. We watched the movie Labyrinth and got party bags.
