Class R

We have asked the question 'what makes me special?' this week and had loads of fun looking at the different answers. We have read the book Super Duper You and The Colour Monster. We have continued to discuss how to behave in school. We read Hippo owns up, Monkey needs to listen, Elephant learns to share, Lion's in a flap and Giraffe is left out.

The children started their first ever maths lessons this week. We looked at matching pictures and objects. We played matching games in our maths area, and on the class iPad. We also matched sets of things.

Unfortunately, the weather this week has kept us indoors for lots of the time. We have used the colours of *The Colour Monster* to sort objects. We have also made handprints in our favourite paint colours and discussed what makes us special.

In between all of this we have watched yoga, mindfulness and exercise videos on the screen. The children are definitely getting used to being in school now, and will be even more independent next week when they rely less on their buddies at break times.

Class 1

This week in English we have continued reading the story of the Rainbow Fish. We completed speech bubbles to show what the little blue fish said to the rainbow fish and wrote his reply. We completed a character profile of the rainbow fish, writing words to describe his personality and his appearance. We also sequenced pictures from the story and practised retelling orally. In Maths we have continued our work on place value within 10. We have learnt how to find one less than a number and compare groups by matching. We have practised the use of the terms fewer, more and the same as well as introducing the terms less than, greater than and equal to along with the symbols which represent these. In Theme we learnt about the physical features of the seaside. We looked closely at a seaside photograph and labelled features such as beach, sea, cave, cliffs. We also looked at photos of rock pools and a bay.

In Science we continued our work on animals including humans and learnt about our sense of sight. We looked closely at our eyes and named the different parts such as iris, pupil, eyelashes, eyelids and eyebrows. We then worked in pairs to test whether two eyes work better than one. We covered one eye whilst our partner waved a counter over a cup. We had to tell our partner to drop the counter when we thought it was over the cup.

Class 2

This week in class two we have been learning about place value. We have used different types of equipment to make two digit numbers and partition them in different ways. We have also been adding multiples of ten to a two digit number.

In English we have continued our work on The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch and have used geographical vocabulary to write about coastal areas making sure we use punctuation in the correct places.

In Science we have continued learning about habitats, we have investigated a coastal habitat and looked at the plants and animals which live there. We then looked at examples of herbivores, carnivores and omnivores which live in woodland habitats and created some food chains We had a fantastic P.E. lesson practising the different types of over arm throwing and using hoops and cones as targets!

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Class 3

This week, Class 3 have used their volcano fact finding to put sentences together to produce paragraphs. We used subheadings to help group our sentences. We then edited our work and produced a final Non-Chronological Report on volcanoes, including a table, pictures and captions. Look out for them on Facebook! In Maths, we have been using apparatus to learn about Place Value. We have been looking at Hundreds Tens and Ones and finding 1, 10 100 more/less than a number. In Computing, we continued our E-safety and used Duolingo to help us with our French.

Class 4

This week Class 4 have been working on their Non-Chronological Reports about earthquakes. They used their notes from our theme lesson last week and had to think of three questions that they felt someone would want to know about earthquakes -these became the subheadings on their reports.

In Science, we have been learning about sound and specifically how sound is caused by vibrations. The children did a sound walk around the school grounds to identify different sounds and decide what was vibrating to cause the sound.

In Maths, we have been representing and partitioning numbers to 10,000. The children quickly picked up the idea of converting 100s to 1000s and 10s to 100s to find more or less than a given number.

In P.E. we continued looking at blocking and defending. The children had to stay on their toes, scan the area and move sideways in order to block the opposing team getting past.

Class 5

This week in Maths class 5 have been focusing on rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000. In English we have read the second chapter of Beowulf. We have done lots of descriptive writing such as describing what the villain's lair looks like, using metaphors, similes and alliteration to create the correct atmosphere.

In Science we have looked at the distance between planets and were shocked at how close to the sun we actually are!

Class 6

This week in Maths, class 6 have continued to look at place value and specifically looked at ordering and comparing numbers up to 10,000,000, and for the last few days we have been refreshing our rounding skills. In Science we have started to learn about classification of living things and we have thought about how we would group certain animals depending on their different characteristics. In English this week we have been focusing on writing a setting description for Grendel's lair, where we have thought carefully about our vocabulary choices and writing features to create the correct atmosphere.

School Meals

The menu for school dinners is on the school website https://www.diggleschool.co.uk/school-meals

Next week is Week 3. The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence.
