HEADTEACHER'S COMMENTS

Thank you to everyone who made such an effort with their children's attire for the Break the Rules day. The day has been a wonderful way to round off a very strange first half term back in school and I would like to thank the FODS team and the school staff for going all out to ensure that the children had a great day.

Parents evening will be taking place the week beginning the 9th November. These will take place either over Zoom or Google Classroom depending on which platform your child's teacher is most comfortable with using. Each class teacher will be contact their parents and let them know which days and times they will have slots available. They will ask you to indicate if there is a time that definitely won't work for you, but will then allocate you a slot rather than you choosing one as is our normal routine. The slots will be for 10 minutes as usual. This is a very different way of working for the staff, so I ask that you be as patient and flexible as you can. However, we really wanted to facilitate something as face-to-face and personal as possible in these challenging times.

Class Information

Class R – This week, there has definitely being something spooky happening in Class R. We have being learning the story 'Room on the Broom', by Julia Donaldson. To help us retell the story, we made our own brooms with sticks we collected around school, (we made sure to make a broom with plenty of room). We also made some 'wanted posters' for the dragon, using the descriptive language we have being developing throughout this half term. In Maths, we have made potions, counting out ingredients and talking about capacity. In Phonics, we learnt the new sounds; h, e, f & I. Finally, we really enjoyed 'Break the Rules' day on Thursday, everyone had a costume, some were really scary, and we had a little party with dancing to Halloween music, decorations, and unhealthy snacks!. Have a great half term. Well done for you fab first half term, Class R!

Class 1 – Class 1 have been fantastic over the past two weeks and have produced some excellent work whilst learning from home. It has been lovely to see them back in school for the end of this week and enjoy a super break the rules day! In Maths this week we have been learning about measuring length, height and weight. We have enjoyed completing some practical activities to compare and order length and weight and use non standard measures to record these. In English we have been predicting what might happen next in the story of the Bog baby and we have written ideas about what we would have done in that situation. We have also considered what characters could be thinking or feeling. In Theme we have been thinking about the different jobs that people do in our local area and recorded what these jobs are and what they involve.

Class 2 – We have been working on writing descriptive sentences this week using the colours and sights of Autumn. We are going to add them to our Autumn display of poems, hedgehogs and colourful leaves! In maths we have been learning how to use empty number lines to add and subtract in jumps of 10. We had a fun day to finish off the half term where we broke all the rules! We had some great costumes and hairstyles, lots of chocolate got eaten and even the teachers came in their PJ's.



As some children have had a disrupted half term due to self isolation we have decided for the foreseeable future to issue effort grades once a term rather than half term-ly. That way we can hopefully ensure that all the children have a good number of weeks in school to base the grades on. Teacher's will of course discuss your child's effort at parent's evening, week beginning the 9th November.

Class Information

Class 3 — This week we have been learning about Shape poems in English. We listened to some and looked at how they were formed and then wrote one about a pumpkin which are displayed in the classroom. We also created a class word bank for autumn leaves before writing another shape poem for our books. In art, we have completed our Egyptian papyrus work and they look fantastic. We had a spooky finish to the week with Halloween activities and great costumes, jokes and treats for 'Break the Rules Day'. Have a great Half Term!

Class 4 – We began our new unit of sequences in maths this week. We have counted up and down in 6s, 7s and 9s to find missing numbers. In English we have again practiced our handwriting and some children have been having fun making the most of their new pen licences. In science we finished our unit by creating our own animals and thinking about their habitats. We looked at the journey to the afterlife in theme and then used Microsoft Word in computing to create a comic strip. We finished the half term with a blast by breaking the rules! The costume were fantastic.

Class 5 - In Maths this week the children have started to look at the formal multiplication method. A lot of the children have found that they can understand how to set the work out but have struggled when faced with times tables that they are not confident with. In Theme, we have looked at the different roles of women and how they changed in the war to help with the war effort! The children also took part in the 'Show Racism the Red Card' talk about really enjoyed asking questions to two ex Manchester City players. We have finished off the week writing a spooky setting description to go with the 'break the rules' day theme.

Class 6 - This week, in English, we have researched the Holocaust. From this, we made notes on key information. We then used this information to create a non-chronological report about it. In theme, we created some amazing Blitz art. To do this, we mixed paint to create a gradient background which looked like a firey sky. We then used black paper to create a silhouette city skyline. We identified landmarks of London so that we could include these. In maths, we have been working on converting fractions to decimals and percentages. The children worked incredibly hard on this.



Show Racism the Red Card


On Tuesday Classes 5 and 6 had the opportunity to talk to Alex Williams and Trevor Sinclair, two ex professions footballs who used to play for Manchester City, about how they had personally been affected by racism.

Before the zoom call we briefly spoke about what racism was and tried to think of a bank of questions that the children could ask. Once on the zoom call the children watched an educational video to give some more information before the Question and answer session. Both Alex and Trevor commented on how thoughtful some of the questions were and some of these will also be passed on to the Manchester City first team, where the players will answer the questions too.
