Class R

At the start of the week, Class R were very excited about Pancake day. We asked 'Why do we have a day where we eat pancakes?' and this led us to look at the Christian celebration of Lent. The children shared things that they could give up for Lent, just as Christians do in memory of Jesus walking in the desert. Class R also read the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes'. They recognised lots of the characters from other traditional tales and all of them felt that Mr Wolf was not treated very kindly by his neighbours. We used the book to help us make our own pancakes and we wrote a class recipe together. Why not ask your child, what do you need to make pancakes?

We also started a new topic this week - Dinosaurs. Mrs Cocker and the children learnt that dinosaurs were prehistoric animals that had legs under themselves. They looked at non fiction books about dinosaurs and identified different dinosaurs. Mrs Cocker received an Emergency email from Mrs Bradbury (who is a secret dinosaur hunter) and there was a T-Rex on the school field!!! She showed the children a video and the children kept spotting dinosaur eggs.

In Maths, the children identified different coins and counted out money to buy the ingredients to make pancakes. We have also looked at the number zero and the composition of number 5. The children had lots of fun completing the Commandos Maths Challenge. They did amazing at counting and using the numicon to find the answer. When they worked out the problem, the children crawled under the nets doing an army crawl.

Class 1


This week in English we started our new class text -Dogger by Shirley Hughes. We read the first couple of pages and then made notes on what we had found out about Dogger so far. We read about how Dave took care of Dogger and sometimes washed him in a bowl of soapy water. We worked together as a class to wash our own soft toy and then looked at the features of instructions before writing a set of instructions for How to wash a toy. In Maths we enjoyed our problem solving activities on the Commando Maths day and we have spent time completing our end of block assessment on place value within 20. In Science we made rain gauges using the plastic bottles we brought in from home. We brought these home ready to measure the rainfall over a week as part of our homework. In Theme we started our new topic 'A Toys Story'. We borrowed a loan box of old toys from the Portland Basin museum and spent time looking at them to see how they were different to our toys at home. We completed a sorting activity using pictures of old and new toys.

Class 2

This week in English we received a book through the post, it came from Bob, the Man on the Moon! We have really enjoyed finding out some things about Bob, where he lives, what his job may be and predicting what he may like or dislike. We even saw some aliens in one of the pictures...We have used the book to help us write questions, predictions and use apostrophes in our writing. In Maths we had a fun time problem solving as commandos and working on problems involving money. We compared amounts, matched equivalents and did lots of counting in 2, 5 and 10. We finished our famous people theme by learning about the life and work of two more historical figures, Louis Braille and Florence Nightingale. We were all excited to see that our hyacinth bulbs have begun to grow over half term and we are keeping fingers crossed that they all come out! We have begun a new music topic focusing on listening, improvising and learning a song about helping each other. We also had fun in PE this week. We have been learning to use a skipping rope. We had some creative moves!!

Class 3

This week, we have started our new science unit 'Animals including Humans'; learning about the human skeleton, naming bones and learning about some of their functions. We started our new text based theme 'Bewilderwood' by meeting the main character and writing a character profile for him as well as developing super sentences to describe his fishing grounds. In PE, we practised our bowling skills in cricket and improved our accuracy. We all enjoyed our Commando Maths Day on Tuesday; solving problems and using our reasoning skills.

Class 4

Class started their new topic *One World* in SMSC by exploring the lives of two children from Malawi. We looked at the word 'poverty' and how this affects children's lives. In English we started our new book *Bewilderwood* by examining the character of Swampy and using our vocabulary to create some amazing descriptive sentences. In computing we recorded ourselves using software and listened back, identifying the difficulties involved and in French we learnt how to describe going to school.

Class 5

It feels like class 5 have been very busy this week. We really enjoyed our mathematics problem solving on our Commando Joe day and really got to grips with this. We have been also working hard on long multiplication and this is going well. Our English has been focussed on Shackleton's diaries and what it might feel like to be a member of the crew at any given point in the journey. Our Science on Forces involved designing and testing parachutes where we concentrated on Fair Testing as well as the skills needed to make working parachutes. As well as this we have been starting our gymnastics in PE and brushing up our direct speech writing skills in our SPAG lessons.

Class 6

This week Class 6 have written diary entries for one of Shackleton's crew members. This involved how the crew members felt in different situations as the Endurance progressed on its' journey. We have also been practising SATS papers to get us ready. In maths we have been doing 1 and 2 step functions. We have also been learning about what a healthy lifestyle is in science, this included us adding up calories and recommending how people can improve their diet. In PE with Chiara, we have started learning hockey, we have been doing lots of fun activities including teaching us how to block and dribble. In our other PE session we carried on with our fitness, moving round the stations to do different exercises, including star jumps, press ups, sit ups and more.

Following on from information given before half term regarding the raffle of the Brand new iPad. FODs have ordered raffle tickets which will be coming home with your children next week.



Each class will be assigned a colour and we would like you to bring in a donation on this day of something themed with your colour. We will provide each class with some ideas of items to bring in !




Raffle Tickets will be available to buy in the coming weeks and the winners will be picked on the day of our Easter Egg Hunt .


