HEADTEACHER'S COMMENTS



The Dates for your Diary has had next Wednesday and Thursday down as transition days in school for a while. Unfortunately, due to the rising numbers of infections in Oldham, Saddleworth School has made the decision to move their transition online. After a conversation with Public Health England, we have taken the decision to do transition slightly differently this year. We are aiming that on one day in the coming weeks all the children in school will spend some time outside in the afternoon with their new class teacher getting to know them and finding out what is in store next year. By doing this outside staff do not cross bubbles. This means that Miss Alker will be available both Wednesday and Thursday to support the year 6 children with their online transition content. If as a Year 6 parent, you want your child to do this at home with you just let school know and the absence will be authorised.

New reception starters will also do their transition outside in the reception area, but parents should have received a separate email with all the information about this. I hope that you can appreciate that we are doing our very best to balance the Covid regulations with providing children with a chance to meet their new teacher. These decisions are not taken lightly but thought through carefully after seeking advice from experts.

Class R

This week in Class R, we have been involved in lots of outdoor activities as we have done another PE session with CITC and completed Forest School activities with Mr Ryan. Class R really enjoyed helping plant some different flowers and finding potatoes in the Garden area. They also developed their teamwork and communication skills by completing a Commando Joe's Challenge, where they had to save animals by crossing a dangerous river. In Maths, we have been practicing our 2D and 3D shapes and problem solving with addition and subtraction. Finally in Phonics, we have been practicing our letter names and our red words.

Class 1


This week in English we have started to retell the story of Lila and the Secret of Rain. We have written a section at a time and used picture prompts to help us remember the order of events. In Maths we have been practising our addition and subtraction. We have used more of our mental strategies for working out in particular holding the number in our head and then using our fingers to count on or back. We have also practised subtraction on a number line. In Theme we have learnt about the physical features of Kenya and enjoyed looking at Mrs McGregor's photos of her trip to climb Mount Kilimanjaro in neighbouring Tanzania.


Class 2

This week in our English lessons, Year 2 have learned how to use apostrophes correctly. When you use apostrophes for contractions, you can join the words together and the apostrophe takes the place of the removed letters. When you use apostrophes for possession, it is used to show that one thing belongs to or is connected to something. This was quite tricky! We have also researched and written about one of the 'Big Five' African animals. We used our research on the i-pads to make notes. We then wrote a research report including pictures and key information about the animal. Lion and leopard were a popular choice. In Maths we have focused on fractions this week finding out more about a half, a quarter, a third and three quarters of quantities and shapes. We enjoyed another healthy lifestyles lesson from CITC.

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Class 3

This week Class 3 have enjoyed reading the adventure of Swampy and meeting the latest character, a huge Thornyclod! We looked at a picture of the great spider like creature and wrote a description. We also had fun writing kennings about swampy. They also learnt about different ways seeds are dispersed and had enjoyed making a paper helicopter seed and releasing it outside in the wind.

Class 4

Class 4 have continued to impress with their amazing art skills in theme this week. After reading another chapter of *Bewilderwood*, the class had a go at drawing 'Twiggle Village'. Some of the results were amazing. In maths, we been working on digital clocks this week and we are now more comfortable converting between analogue and digital using 12 and 24 hour time. In Science we studied how to change the pitch of a sound and in theme we looked at life's obstacles and how we can overcome them.

Class 5

This week in Class 5 we have researched the animal behaviourist Jane Goodall in Science and learnt all about her work in Gombe, Africa observing and studying chimpanzees. In maths we have been comparing and ordering numbers with up to 3 decimal places. In English we have started to write up a descriptive setting for a final room in The Nowhere Emporium, thinking carefully about building and developing sentences before writing in full paragraphs. In Theme, we have made 'top trump cards' for the different Maya gods that we have learnt about.

Class 6

This week we really enjoyed our trip to Kingswood and had a great time taking part in the different activities; crate stack, Jacob's ladder and night line. In English we have written a report to explain the different theories about why the Titanic sank. In Maths, we have been dividing fractions by whole numbers and have looked at matching equations up with the correct answers using our reasoning skills. We have also spent some time practising the production, without using our scripts.

The times of the online Welcome Evenings are below: they are spread out across the week to accommodate those families with more than one child in school.



Urgent message from Oldham Council

EU Settlement Scheme -There is are now less than 2 weeks to go until the EU Settlement Scheme deadline of 30 June 2021.

There are growing concerns locally and nationally that elderly people, some of whom may have resided in the UK for many years, have not applied to the scheme in the numbers expected and also families lacking awareness that they also need to complete applications for their children (including children born in the UK). If you know anyone this may apply to - please check, they have done what they need to with respect to this scheme.

EU, EEA or Swiss citizens, and their family members need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue living, working, studying and accessing healthcare, pensions, benefits in the UK after 30 June 2021. Failure to apply may mean that residents cannot access healthcare or welfare benefits to which they are entitled.
