Class R

Our minibeast topic has focused on spiders this week. The children have learnt about *Anansi* - the spider from West African traditional tales. We have had fun using playdough and pipe cleaners to mould our own spiders. We have also used spider-themed letter formation sheets to improve our writing. We have written sentences about spiders and watched another episode of *Teeny Tiny Creatures*.

Some of the children brought some amazing spider-themed *show-and-tell* objects in from home too.

In maths, we have finished our 3D shape unit and moved onto repeating patterns. The children were able to recognise, continue and create their own repeating patterns. We used movements first (clapping and stomping were popular) and then tried to come up with word patterns.

Class 1

This week in English we have read more of our story 'The Naughty Bus.' We wrote words to describe how it might have felt driving through the beans and why the bus didn't think much of the roads. We also spent time thinking of words to describe the movement of the bus such as speeding and braking before adding a preposition such as along and through to add details about where the bus was moving like this, and writing in full sentences.

In Maths, we have continued with our multiplication and division topic, counting in 5s and recognising equal and unequal groups. We also learnt about adding equal groups and using arrays.

In Theme we learnt about the history of Cars. We found out that the first car type vehicle was called a steam carriage and used a boiler to produce steam to power the front wheel. We learnt about different popular cars and when they were introduced to the market. Then we compared a modern car to the first petrol engine car called the Benz Patent Motorwagon. We labelled the different features of each vehicle.

We have enjoyed listening to the different instrument groups perform for us this week and lots of us were interested in learning to play next year. We really enjoyed Open Day! We completed some fun transport themed activities and spent time in class with our parents and family members.

Class 2

This week we continued our 'There and back' theme by investigating cars and aeroplanes. We looked at how people travel by car and the ways it has changed. We sorted different cars onto a timeline and wrote about them. We also found out about two American brothers called Wilbur and Orville Wright who were always very interested in flying. In 1903, Orville took off on the first ever engine powered aeroplane flight. The flight only lasted 12 seconds but the aeroplane did fly! We watched a modern day jumbo jet take off and compared the differences on planes nowadays with the flight of Flyer 1. We agreed that the Flyer looked a bit flimsy but would be fun to try! We then made our own paper aeroplanes. We chose 3 designs, to try to find which would fly the furthest and which would stay airborne the longest. The Dart went furthest and the Stable stayed up longest. In Maths we have continued working with 2D and 3D shapes. This week we have focussed on vertical lines of symmetry and symmetrical patterns. We enjoyed the music presentations from the different groups in school which have taken place this week, it was fun to see how the different instruments sound and how they are played. In PE this week we worked on developing the throwing and catching skills used in a game of cricket.

Class 3

This week Class 3 have been reading more of The BFG, answering questions, finding ways the author has described the characters and looking at speech. We enjoyed taking on the role of Sophie and the BFG for our speech role play. In maths, we have been converting, comparing and adding/subtracting volume and capacity. We have had to use several steps and our reasoning skills to solve some of the trickier questions.

We have been learning all about the skeleton in science, naming some of the main bones and looking at their functions. We also looked at how muscles work in pairs and made a model to demonstrate how they work and that muscles can only pull not push.

Open day was lots of fun and we made 2 dream catchers, linked to our theme The BFG, to take home and also hang in school. Our classroom looks very colourful!

Class 4

This week Class 4 have continued to read our class text 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl, and are beginning to think some of the staff might fit the criteria for a witch, as laid out in chapter 3. To help them find and expose witches - they have written letters to Mr Hoyle (the member of staff who truly can't be a witch) to let him know about their suspicions. In Maths, we have started to move onto decimals and particularly tenths, and place value in relation to the decimal point.

In Science, we have been investigating gas and learning about the scientist Joseph Priestley. Why not ask your child what Joseph Priestley discovered? The children also gave themselves an additional challenge of coming up with an experiment to answer the question "Are fizzy drinks heavier than water?".

In PE, we moved onto our athletics unit last week, and practiced sprinting. This week, we have looked at different styles of long jump and practiced hop, skip jumps.

Class 4 enjoyed sharing their learning with parents, grandparents and carers on Monday. They created a variety of 'how to comics' and videos, focusing on being kind, a skill they have in school or meeting expectations around school. Some of these will be displayed in our practical area to inform others.

Class 5

This week in Maths Class 5 have been finding missing angles around points and straight lines, using given angles to find a missing amount. In English we have been looking at descriptive writing, the children have used relative and subordinate clauses to add information to their writing and have used a range of figurative writing features to enhance description. In science we have been comparing gestation periods of different animals and looking for any patterns. In Theme we have identified mountains in South America using atlases. We have also finished our class tree, the children have each made branches to add using tissue paper and card.

Class 6

This week in English, we have been learning poems off by heart, thinking particularly about how they should be delivered, focusing on the speed of the poem, using clear voices and the tone and volume of the poem. We presented these poems to parents as part of our open day. In Maths we continued with our shape topic, including learning about the characteristics of a circle and the angles in a triangle, quadrilateral, and polygon.

In Theme we have been researching mountain ranges across the world and placing them on a map, and we have started to look at our new topic of South America. Finally, in SMSC, we looked at the benefits of a good sleep routine and how exercise can have a positive impact on our minds and bodies. This week in photos. 




Special Shout Outs






