Class R

Class R have been learning about rockets this week. We have read the story 'A trip in a Rocket' about a team of children who use their imagination to build a rocket. We then discussed what teamwork is and used these skills in teams to build our own! We have also discussed healthy eating and used different fruits to make fruit rockets! We then completed a review. Discussing which fruits we liked and disliked. The children the wrote a shopping list including the fruits they would like to try! In Maths we have carried one exploring our number bonds to 10 using our rhyme! We have also explored the number 14, using our 10 fingers and 4 toes!

This week we have focused on using kind words. We have discussed how the words we use are our own responsibility and discussed how they can make other people feel sad. We looked at ourselves in the mirror and pulled funny faces and sad faces and decided that we only want to see ourselves being kind and happy!

This week our word of the week is 'Coronation', we watched a clip of the Queen being coronated and wrote a sentence about Queen Elizabeth!

Finally, we had a party day to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee, we danced to music, ate cakes and decorated crowns!

Class 1

This week in English we started by sorting sentences into statements, exclamations and questions then we have been working on our phonics skills. We have played lots of phonics games to practise the trickier sounds including phonics bingo, phonics snap, read and roll and phonics boom! In maths we have been learning about different turns and using language to describe position and direction. We have used our bodies to practise guarter, half, three guarter and whole turns. We have used the words left, right, clockwise and anti clockwise to describe the direction of our turns. We have practised turning objects and shapes through the different turns and we have described the position of objects in a grid using the words top, middle, bottom row and first, second, third from the right/left. In Theme we learnt about the history of flight. The earliest way to fly was the hot air balloon until the invention of the first aeroplane by the Wright brothers in 1903.

We have been busy this week practising our 'Saturday Night' dance and we really enjoyed performing for everyone on Friday afternoon. We had a fantastic day of Jubilee activities and enjoyed our picnic lunch.

Class 2

This week in Class 2 we have been out and about in the school grounds investigating microhabitats as part of our science work. We had identification sheets and magnifying glasses and looked carefully to see what creatures we could find. It was fun but we worked carefully and made sure we were respectful and always left places as we found them. We had already learned about woodland and urban habitats so this week we found out which animals and plants live in our coastal and pond habitats. We also know we must have an adult with us and be very careful when we are near water.

In maths we have been counting in different ways and recapping tens and ones with various activities. We also enjoyed writing some poetry about Queen Elizabeth II. We made lists of nouns, adjectives and verbs and then combined them to make our own list poems. We had some great vocabulary to use including monarch, dignified and dutiful as well as crown, hats and handbag! We discussed how the Queen always has a handbag and decided what she may carry in it and why. We had some great guesses including a snack for between events, lipstick to always look nice and a mobile phone to chat to friends. We loved our jubilee picnic lunch and dancing for friends and family on Friday.











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Class 3

This week, Class 3 have written diary pages in the style of Sophie and The BFG. It was great fun writing in Gobblespeak and getting our grammar wrong for the BFG! We also wrote a recipe to make the 'filthsome snozzcumber' taste better; using time connect words and imperative verbs as well as headings and subheadings. In Maths, we have been learning how many days are in the months of the year and using our knowledge of time to convert hours (and parts of hours) into minutes. In science, we used the ipads to research animals and their bones, compared them to humans and wrote a page about the facts we discovered and supported these with pictures.

Class 4

Class 4 have had forest school in the afternoons this week. We have started to build the rabbit hutch and the children have used saws, drills and nail guns (under the supervision of Mr Ryan) to construct it, based on the plans our class came up with earlier in the year. We've learnt a lot! In maths we have been translating shapes and in SMSC we looked at how adverts tempt us to spend money. In science we made complete circuits using switches and motors, and in English we continued with *The Witches*. On Friday we had our final PE lesson of the unit with Kiara and finished off the week with our amazing dance of Shakira's 2010 hit 'Waka Waka'.


Class 5

In Class 5 this week we have focused on creating our Victorian toys; looking carefully about how these can be made and then trying this out for ourselves; trying to create working cams and mechanisms to get the objects to move. In English we then tried to write a set of instructions which would explain how to someone else can create their own Victorian toy. In Maths we have been solving word problems involving addition and subtractions calculations.

Class 6

This week Class 6 have been learning about the Industrial revolution, conditions of workhouses and started to create a victorian moving toy as part of our Victorian Theme. We have also spent time learning our dance for the Jubilee celebration and have auditioned for our roles in the end of year production. We have also continued to work on tasks for the Memorial garden; creating posters and designs; contacting local companies via telephone or email to confirm or ask for further help/donations. Some of us also had a transition talk with a representative from Saddleworth School, who came in the have a chat with us about things we might be worried about. We will have another two session with her after half term.






Amazing Day at the Circus
