Class R

Our final 4 days of the Spring term have been filled with fun Easter activities. We have finalised our wonderful Easter cards. We have enjoyed completing Easter word-searches and Easter phonics colourings. We have also practiced our handwriting skills using Easter words.

In maths we have consolidated our knowledge of doubling. The children have used their fingers, counters, dice, dominoes and everyday objects to spot doubles up to 12. We have also revisited odds and evens to finish off our maths unit *Building 9 and 10.*

Class 1

This week in English we have finished reading our class text 'Meerkat Mail.' We wrote thought and feeling bubbles for Sunny during his visit to Madagascar. We wrote sentences about how Sunny felt and why, when he visited Aunty Bea and Uncle Rob's. Lastly we compared Sunny's first and last postcards and discussed why he had decided to return home in the end.

In Maths we have completed our unit on Mass and Volume. WE have compared volume using the terms more and less, full, half full, nearly full, nearly empty and empty. We have measured capacity using cups and cubes and compared capacity using the greater than and less than symbols.

This week has been computing week. We have completed a unit on digital painting using an app called Sketchbook. We practised using the various tools such as the pencil, paintbrush, eraser and paint fill to find out what they do. We then used specific tools to create our images such as a self portrait. We also looked at the work of famous artists such as Piet Mondrian, Henri Matisse and Wassily Kandinsky and selected the most appropriate tools to create work inspired by each artist. We learnt how to save our work in Google Drive.

Class 2

In English this week we have been investigating the aliens in the story Man on the Moon. We used this to help us draw our own aliens, thinking carefully about what they would look like and how they might behave. Then we wrote descriptions of them using different sentence types, apostrophes, adjectives and verbs. We polished up our handwriting by working with our handwriting pens this week. We have been learning any common exception words which we are finding tricky and trying to use them in our written work. In Maths we have completed learning checks for multiplication and division. This will help us focus on areas which we still need to work on. We then completed a pre-learning check for our next maths topic focused on shape. We also enjoyed a visit from our Year 2 governor, Mrs Boon, who joined us in class on Tuesday morning. Finally, as it is the end of term, we have been looking forward to the Easter holidays and celebrations. We wrote about activities we will be doing over Easter.

Chocolate seemed to feature heavily! Happy Easter everyone from Year 2.

Class 3

What a busy week! On Monday, Class 3 performed their dress rehearsal for the whole school, followed by 2 performances for family members. The children worked really hard on their poems, songs, jokes and dances and really enjoyed seeing it come together, along with Class 4.

In maths we have been learning about scales and mass, using grams to measure weights.

In theme, we have been learning about the Roman Baths and looked at mosaics, producing our own.

Roman Day was a huge success and the children looked amazing! We enjoyed tasting food they would have eaten in Roman times, such as quince jelly, olives, dates and feta cheese, as well as learning about some more unusual foods they would have eaten. We didn't add jellyfish, dormice or cows udders to our tasting sessions, but we did write our own menus, using 'masterchef phrases' and adjectives to make the menu sound more appetizing. It was quite a challenge!

Class 4

This week, Class 4 have been busy with our performances and a big congratulations to all the kids for their hard work. We hope all the parents enjoyed it.

We also went to experience Easter which was run by Ground Breakers. The children did different activities all linked to the Easter Story.

In Maths, we have finished off equivalent fractions and we will do some more work on fractions after the holidays.

In computing, we turned our iPads into data loggers and recorded sound and light data ready to process. The children made predictions about what time it would be lightest and loudest!

In theme, we produced a leaflet for our own Roman baths. We learnt about the features of Roman baths and the children had to use their persuasive writing to get people to choose their bath.

Roman day was a big success! The children made Roman honey biscuits and wrote down the instructions. The biscuits came out great and we were able to share them with Class 3.

Class 5

This week in Maths we have been looking at statistics and how to read and interpret graphs and tables. In English we have written a newspaper report. We have reported a mysterious guest intruding on the birthday party of one of our main characters. In science we looked at metamorphosis and how butterflies, frogs, newts and dragonflies change form. We also had our last city thrive session where the children looked at how we can use exercise as a form or stress relief.

Class 6

This week in maths we have been continuing with our statistics topic by reading, interpreting and presenting data in pie charts and carefully learning how to use a protractor to measure degrees accurately.

In English we have been busy writing our own Jon-chronological reports about creatures we have created. The children initially found it quite difficult to think about the features that might be needed, but they have really tried hard to also include a range of writing features that are needed across a range of different texts and genres.


We also enjoyed watching class 3 and 4's performance at the start of the week and thought the children all did really well, learning the different poems and songs.

Proposal

We are proposing that from September 2024 Diggle School will run a governor led school nursery in the porta cabin for children aged 3 and above.

The nursery will be run by existing qualified school staff. We are pleased that Mrs Hawes will be the lead practitioner with Miss Leach supporting the setting.

Rationale

- Having our own nursery will provide an excellent transition for children into reception.
- The school can plan the curriculum that is delivered in the nursery setting ensuring that children are school ready when they enter reception.
- We can start early phonics and number work in nursery
- It will also give us the opportunity to ensure early identification of special needs.
- The nursery and reception class can operate as an EYFS unit sharing planning, visits and experiences.
- We can offer parents wrap around care through our Before and After School Club.
- We can offer children hot school meals

If you would like your child to start music lessons please contact the school office to enquire about availability and financial commitment.


School Band Rehearsal Dates
