

Class R

This week Class R have started their new topic 'Space'. In Literacy we have been looking at non fiction books and learnt about what a fact is, we played the game fact and false. We have also been writing facts for out Space Station in the classroom. We have started to read the story 'WHATEVER NEXT!' and used Baby Bears imagination to make our own rocket from boxes and space boots, using our wellies. We have also been super creative this week using paper mache to make planets for our classroom and used tinfoil to paint the milky way and Earth. In Maths, we have been focusing on the number 10 and learnt the song 'Ten Green Bottles'. We filled bottles with green paint and water and practiced putting them in order. We then started to learn about number bonds to 10 by sharing cubes with a partner. The children then challenged themselves to writing number sentences with paint in our outdoor area! In Phonics, we have recapped some sounds and red words we found tricky. In RE, we learnt all about Ramadan and Eid, discussing what we would give up and how it would feel to fast. We made crescent decorations and practiced henna designs on hand cut outs. In PE, we practiced running and stopping next to a cone, if we didn't have a cone we were out, we had to be super quick! We then pretended to be little fish and sharks, hopefully avoiding the sharks!

Class 1

This week in English we have started a new book called 'Naughty Bus'. We looked at the first page and made predictions about what might be inside the present and then what adventures the naughty bus might go on around the house. We looked for clues in the pictures about where the naughty bus might work and wrote our ideas in sentences. We have written thought bubbles for the people at the bus stop who the bus drove straight past. We have also looked at the use of capital letters and exclamation marks in the text and how the writer wants us to read it. In Maths we have been learning to read and write numbers to 20 in words and numerals. We have read number sentences written in words and written our answers as a word. We have read numbers in words and shown the matching numeral on our number fans. We have practised writing number words on whiteboards and in our books and we have played number word bingo and snap games. In Theme we started our new topic 'There and Back' all about how transport has changed over time. We looked at a number of different forms of transport and when they were first used including a sedan chair which was first used around 4000 years ago. In art we learnt about the primary and secondary colours and used paints to mix these colours and present them on a colour wheel.

Class 2

In Maths this week we have been working hard on number bonds to 10 to help us with those which make 20. We have also begun work in our maths 'busy books' to consolidate and practise maths skills. In Mastering number sessions we worked on recall of number bonds of 10 as well as within 10, and learned that numbers can be added in any order and the sum remains the same. We are trying to work flexibly when adding 2 numbers and exploring ways to represent this. For our English work we have enjoyed the story of Fe Fi Fo Fum and basing our written work on the story. We have written command sentences and worked on spelling and writing contracted words such as aren't, can't and didn't. We have been working more on our handwriting preparing for more joined writing and begun our reading 'busy books', this week spelling words with the alternative ee digraph.

Our music work this half term is focusing on rock music. We had fun this week learning about pulse, rhythm and pitch, moving to the beat, clapping rhythms and warming up our voices. We really enjoyed joining in with the song 'We will rock you', by Queen, stomping and clapping and using a body percussion beat!











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Class 3

This week, Class 3 began their new text 'The BFG'. we answered questions from the text, looking at how the author used words and language to create images and drew a picture of the street from the description. In maths, we have been working on multiplication and division; trying to get quicker with our mental calculations as well as using our formal calculation methods. Forest School has been great fun. We made Dream Catchers and finished with the week with a camp fire.

Class 4

New topics galore for class 4 this week! In maths we learnt about decimal numbers. We spoke about how these are 'in between number' and contain tenths and hundredths. We then multiplied these number by 10 and 100, shifting the numbers across the columns. For English we began our new Roald Dahl book *The Witches*. We researched Norway and made a poster, and also used our artistic skills to create sketches of witches. For science we studied electricity. We thought about how electricity is generated and considered renewable and non-renewable methods. A great first week back!

Class 3 have had a great week at Forest School

Class 3 have enjoyed their Forest School sessions this week. They have collected willow branches and prepared them before weaving them to make Dream Catchers, decorating them with things they collected from the environment.



Class 5

In Class 5 this week we have started to learn about our Theme- The Victorians and have looked at a timeline of events which occurred during this period of history. In Maths we have been ordering and comparing numbers up to 1 million. We have also started to learn about the Titanic in English and have discussed areas or research together as a class and then independently tried to write our findings in our own words. We have started our new Science topic-Animals, including humans where we have looked at the different stages of human growth.

Class 6

This week Class 6 have started their English topic - The Titanic; they have researched the disaster of the Titanic to give themselves more information about what happened and have began to write information in their own words to write a non-chronological report; thinking carefully about the title and subheadings they can use. They have also recapped main and subordinate clauses and the use of apostrophes for possession and contraction. In Maths we have looked at ratio and proportion and have used our multiplication and division facts to answer words problems.
