### <u>Class R</u>

The children had their first phonics lessons this week. We have looked at the sounds m, s, d, a and t. The children have really impressed me with their hard work practising sounding and forming their letters.

We also started our brand new topic *Autumn*. Some of the children brought in some interesting finds from home, including acorns, conkers, leaves and twigs.

In the creative area, we have used pincers to collect conkers and count them out in jars. This tested their counting skills and their fine motor skills.

In the 'messy area' we have created an investigation area where we have displayed the conkers collected from the school forest. The children have used magnifying glasses to explore what they could see and describe it to their friends.

We have also read the books Autumn, A Surprise for Dumpy and The Nutty Nut Chase, watched an autumn-themed Cosmic Yoga and the BBC video What is Autumn.

In maths we sorted a variety of objects into groups, identifying their differences. We have also created our own sorting rules.

We also celebrated the *Abilities In Me* day on Monday by dressing in colourful clothes and discussing what makes us different.

# <u>Class 1</u>

This week in English we have started to read the story of the Lighthouse Keeper's lunch. We enjoyed how cheeky the seagulls were and we worked on a rotation of four activities based on the book. We wrote Mrs Grinling's shopping list, sounded out words to label a seaside scene, re told the story using story props and completed seaside themed pencil control. In Maths we have completed our work on place value within 10, learning to compare numbers using the greater than and less than symbols, ordering objects and numbers and using the number line. We have also started our unit of work on addition and subtraction within 10 by learning about parts and wholes. In Art we used paper strips to design our own beach huts. We think they look great on our corridor display! In Theme we learnt about the human features of the seaside and sorted some pictures into human or physical. In Science we learnt about our sense of touch. We named the different parts of our hands and carried out a simple test with a feely bag to see if our sense of touch alone could help us to identify the mystery objects.

# <u>Class 2</u>

This week in Maths we have been learning about number lines. We have looked at different number lines with intervals or one or ten. We have found missing numbers on the lines which was a little tricky if the lines didn't start with one or ten

In Science we have been using our life processes knowledge to work out if things are dead, living or never alive. In our Theme lessons we have been researching the creatures which live in a rockpool micro habitat. We drew a detailed rockpool and learnt how to carefully label it using a sharp pencil and ruler.

During one of our English lessons we had a surprise when Mrs Newton told us that a lady who looked like Mrs Grinling from 'The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch' had hand delivered a letter asking Year Two for tasty lunch box ideas. We thought of lots of delicious lunchbox ideas and practised writing them with commas in a list.

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## Class 3

This week Class 3 have enjoyed reading and listening to a range of poems; looking at the different styles and identifying word types and features. We have focussed on shape poems and enjoyed looking at how they are designed. In Maths, we have continued with place value, ordering and comparing 3 digit numbers and using our reasoning skills to tackle word problems. We have enjoyed our earthquake drills during this week, as we learnt more about how tectonic plates can affect the Earth. We've also compared rocks in Science looking for differences, and using a magnifying glass to see particles. In Computing, we began to look at inputs and outputs and how digital devices work as part of our 'Computing systems' unit.

## Class 4

This week in Class 4 we have been looking at narrative poems and the features of poems; practicing adjectives, adverbs, similes and onomatopoeia. In Maths, we have continued with place value and using number lines to help us order and sequence numbers to 10,000. In theme, we have continued to look at volcanoes and created some wonderful volcano shadow prints of eruptions.

In Science, we have been exploring the amplitude of sound. We planned and experimented with tuning forks on different surfaces to see which surface produces the loudest sound. Finally in French and SMSC we have been talking about friends and family.

## <u>Class 5</u>

This week in Maths, Class 5 have been looking at addition and subtraction, written and mental methods. We have recapped how to borrow and carry when doing addition and subtraction. In English we have written a recount of the events during our trip this week, focussing on what we learned about while we were there and using

fronted adverbials in our writing. During our trip this week we learned about what life was like for the Vikings. We learned about each of the roles of a Viking and how each one was important. In P.E. we have been focussing on invasion games and how to trick defenders.

#### Class 6

This week in Class 6 we have been consolidating our learning on the place value topic so far and have started to recap basic addition and subtraction strategies. In English we have written a job application as Beowulf to apply for the role of 'Monster Killer' to help King Hrothgar and the Danes to defeat the evil monster Grendel, who has been wreaking terror on the land for over 12 winters. In Theme we have looked at King Alfred the

Great and King Athelstan - both of whom were influential Anglo-Saxon kings during their reigns during the Viking period of invasion. In P.E. we have looked at developing our skills in different gaming situations and thought about how to pass and receive a ball and use these tactics and adapted them to a game of Danish Longball. To support this amazing charity, the children came to school in their brightest clothes and we managed to raise £69.30.

#### Year 5 and 6 Viking Day Experience at Murton Park

Year 5 and 6 had a fantastic time at Murton Park on Wednesday for their Viking Experience. The children learnt the main roles of Vikings during the time period and also the importance of food- without this, it has been found, that many Vikings actually lost their lives due to hunger and not through fighting.

Once they entered the Viking Village the children met the Lady of the village and agreed to work for her for the day. Their tasks included: building their strategy skills to help think of new defensive and attacking tactics, learning the basic commands when in battle, holding a spear and shield to protect the village from an Anglo-Saxon invasion, crafting a clay tallow candle holder so that their homes can be lit up during the dark nights, and finally learning how to make bread by grinding grain on the grindstone to make flour, and then mixing this with water to make bread.

The children then spent some time in the Lady's long house where she explained to them how living conditions of the Vikings are still similar to how some children in other countries live, and we had some reflection time to think about how fortunate we are.

It was a full day of engaging and interactive tasks where the children were able to take part in hands-on activities to make their learning more memorable.



#### **School Meals**

The menu for school dinners is on the school website https://www.diggleschool.co.uk/school-meals

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

#### **Music Lessons**

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence. Lessons will be as follows: Monday - Singing (from after half term) Tuesday - Brass Wednesday - Percussion, Woodwind, Keyboard Thursday - Guitar Please ensure your child brings their instrument with them where applicable on the day stated above.
