## Class R

This week Class R have had a very busy week focusing on transition to Year 1 and of course our Pirate day. Class $R$ have all made Mrs Mellor a little booklet with information about their favourite books, their families and other bits of information to help Mrs Mellor get to them a little better before September. They have also dictated questions they wanted to ask Mrs Mellor at their 'Meet the Class Teacher' session with her on Friday. They asked some super interesting questions, showing their excellent communication and language skills. On Thursday it was Pirate Day, ran by The Rainbow Factory. The whole of Class R got involved, dressing up as pirates and working hard in their pirate training - we even had a pirate themed lunch! In Phonics, the children have continued to practice the different digraphs and trigraphs we
have learnt this term.
Phew! What a fun filled week!

## Class 1

This week in English we have finished writing our re-tell of Lila and the Secret of Rain. We also looked at some examples of African call and response poem/chants and joined in with these. We then worked in pairs to write our own based on the story and practised performing them to a beat played on the African drums. In Maths we have been learning about multiplication and division using arrays and cubes to help us work out the answers. In Theme we learnt about the Maasai tribes who live on the Savannahs of Kenya. We found out lots of facts and were very impressed with their jumping dance. In art we painted African animal prints.

## Class 2

We have had a busy week in Class 2 doing lots of different activities. We have worked hard on our theme work learning about the Maasai tribes who live in the Maasai Mara in Kenya. We discussed what 'culture' is and thought about our own culture and lifestyle. What foods do we like to eat, what do we wear, what type of music do we like and how do we perform it and what arts we enjoy and why. We
learned about a day in the life of a Maasai child and compared it to our own. We even tried the famous Maasai jumping dance, some of us were very good! In our Maths work we have practised lots of different ways to represent 2 digit numbers, with equipment, coins, number grids and calculations. In art work we looked at camouflage patterns and used pastels to draw African animals camouflaged in their environment. We also enjoyed a fun afternoon of pizza making on Thursday with CITC. 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## Class 3

Class 3 have enjoyed making their characters this week by following their design sheets. They then used the ipad to take a photo of their finished characters in a habitat within the school grounds. In maths, we went through an assessment on word problems, looking at where we needed to improve. We also continued with our 4 operations and assessed further areas. In writing, we have written a 'Giggle spell' for the witch in Bewilderwood and made a book containing these as well as our Kennings from last week.

## Class 4

Class have been working on pictograms in maths this week. We have remembered to use a key, answered comparison, sum and difference questions and finished the week off by creating our own pictograms. In English we continued with Bewilderwood and had a go at a piece of independent writing, remembering to include direct speech, noun phrases, powerful verbs and prepositions. We also used the iPads to research our sweepstake
nation and produced a poster with captions, headings and subheadings. In theme we sketched spiders and boots, while in PE we continued with athletics.

## Class 5

This week in maths class 5 have looked at squared and cubed numbers and also recapped equivalent fractions; creating a fractions wall to help them visually see which fractions are the same as others. In English this week we have written our own independent pieces of writing by rewriting the events of the Nowhere Emporium when Daniel enters a wonder room. In Science the class have researched and explained the life cycles of insects and amphibians, looking specifically at frogs, butterflies, newts and dragonflies.

## Class 6

Class 6 have had an extremely busy week this week. On Monday we went on our second trip to Kingswood. Here we experienced the heights of the climbing wall, braved the leap of faith and tested our teamwork skills in problem solving. On Wednesday and Thursday we had our secondary school transition days. We were able to virtually meet various teachers and took part in lots of activities from different subjects. On Thursday evening, we had a barbecue which Mr Ryan and Mrs Cocker very kindly helped with. On Friday, a crime had been committed which we had to use various forensic techniques to work out the culprit from the main suspects, Mr Hoyle, Mrs Cocker and Mrs Hazlehurst.

## Year 6 visit Kingswood - day 2

Our fun at Kingswood started with a last minute change of venue as the dreaded Covid had struck among the activity leaders at Dearne Valley ... luckily we were able to transfer to the Penistone Kingswood site - and the children showed great resilience to the last minute changes. The activities continued with climbing, problem solving and the amazing "leap of faith". All the children had a go at everything they worked great as a team in the problem solving, and encouraged each other to push themselves on the climbing and leap of faith. Well done to everyone for being such great sports!


## Year 6 BBQ and fun day

As part of the leaving events for year 6, we had a BBQ on Thursday evening and an amazing surprise day on Friday where we became crime scene investigators. We had to wear suits to preserve the evidence. We used fingerprints, DNA, imprints of footprints and tyres to work out the guilty party. We also created an e-fit of Mr Hoyle - this proved more difficult than it seemed. We studied different types of rocks through a microscope to try to work out where the suspect had been prior to being at the scene of the crime.
