Class R

In Class R this week we have been learning about and celebrating National StoryTelling Week. This compliments our topic this term, Fairy Tales, with this week's story being Cinderella. We read the story and then retold it using actions, the children were really enthusiastic and got into character well.. Part of our discussions included identifying what makes a villain and how to spot a good character in the story. The children created their own spells and curses in the water tray, explaining what they were using and what the spells/curses did.

In numeracy we explored time using egg timers and stopwatches. We timed how many claps, star jumps and faces drawn they could do in a minute. To understand time the children worked out when Cinderella woke up, cleaned, went to the ball and lost her slipper at midnight. The children were very creative when decorating their own slippers with glitter, they look stunning! We also made our own bookmarks and practised writing with quills.

In the construction area we designed our own fairy tale castles, including draw bridges, turrets and security cameras!! We ended the week reading our favourite stories with our Class 6 buddies. What a busy week!

<u>Class 1</u>

This week in English we have been focusing on the thoughts and feelings of characters in the Beegu story. We read up to the part where Beegu joined the children in the playground and wrote about what the children might think and say, what the teacher might think and what Beegu might be thinking. We then read up to the part where Beegu's parents find her and wrote sentences to explain where they had been and how they

found her. In Maths we have been continuing our learning about the numbers to 20. We have looked at using a number line to compare numbers and use the language of greater than, less than and equal to. We have completed missing numbers and estimated where numbers sit on the number line. In Theme this week we have learnt about two more famous people. We learnt about Rosa Parks who refused to give up her seat on a bus to take a stand for equal rights. We also learnt about the incredible achievement of Neil Armstrong and how important it was to the world when he walked on the moon. We are looking forward to sharing our knowledge with you when you visit us on Monday for Open day.

<u>Class 2</u>

This week in English we have been working on command sentences using bossy verbs. We have used our class story of 'The three little wolves and the Big Bad Pig' to help us. It was fun giving commands and acting them out first before we chose pictures from the book to use when writing commands for the pig from the wolves. In Maths we worked on sorting 3D shapes and shape patterns. We made our own patterns, used reasoning to work patterns out and solved some problems too. We also continued to investigate IT. First we explored its benefits. We made a 'human computer'. We had a 'scanner' to scan the barcode on some shopping. This linked to an 'item finder' which recognised that we had a tin of beans and a banana, then it sent the information to a 'price finder' which found the price of our items and 'added' them up. Wow! We then looked at using IT safely. We learned to never share passwords or our name and address, not to send unkind messages and always ask permission before taking a picture of someone. In our RE lessons we learned about the ways we can help and support others such as being involved in charities, volunteering or just being a kind friend.







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<u>Class 3</u>

This week Class 3 have learnt a lot about rocks! We have investigated properties, including permeability, and organised them in a table according to our findings. We compared 2 different rock, looking for differences and similarities, grouped them according to our findings and also looked at materials deriving from rocks such as glass, metals from ores and plastic from oil found under rocks. In our Europe theme, we visited the Netherlands, trying different cheeses and learning about, and experimenting with impasto paint used by the Dutch artist Vincent van Gogh. We all managed to improve our sequences in gymnastics and focussed on a forward roll...even Mrs Spencer!

Class 4

We looked at coughs, splutters and sneezes in SMSC this week. After discussing how to avoid the spread of bacteria and disease, we made up songs with new words to tell everyone about it. In computing we discussed what can be trusted on the internet and in theme we focussed on the Netherlands. We tried Dutch cheese, made art inspired by Van Gogh, and located human and physical features on a map.

<u>Class 5</u>

This week in English Year 5 have written a descriptive piece on Antarctica. We did this independently seeing how our writing skills would stand up on their own! We focussed on the use senses and how the region affects you to build this up. In mathematics we have continued to work on fractions and mixed numbers honing our calculation skills. Our theme work has also been skill focussed looking at compass directions . We also drew a birds eye version of Shackleton's Oceanc Camp. In contrast part of pur PE work was on co-operative activities based on Tim Peake's experiences as an astronaut!

Class 6

In English this week we have been focusing on writing a descriptive setting for Antarctica, the children have worked really hard to develop and enhance their vocabulary choices to further improve their ideas. In maths we have continued to look at ratio and the multiplicative relationship that we can see between numbers. In Science this week we have looked closely at the heart and the children were given the opportunity to look at a lamb's heart; where they tried to find the blood vessels and chambers that we have learnt previously. In computing we have continued to design our own webpages and have learnt about how to navigate through different pages by adding hyperlinks.


Children can enjoy our vast outdoor areas and take part in seasonal crafts. Morning and afternoon snacks/drinks are provided, lunch to be provided by the parents.
