Class R

This week Class R have being using their mathematical reasoning skills as we explored how to measure capacity and mass. We talked about how to make predictions and the test to see if we are right. The children rushed to explore different types of scales and tried measuring and comparing the mass of different classroom items using the pan scales. The children talked about how they could tell is something was heavy and light by if it went up or down and some children had a go weighing things and recording how much they weighed using non standard measures. The children were also able to make predictions when looking at capacity and when comparing how many aqua beads different containers held. They noticed that the small fat container held more than the tallest container. Which was against what many of them had predicted.

Another focus this week was World Book Day. Many of the children were excited to wear a costume based of a book they had read and on the day they looked fantastic! The children completed lots of reading activities but they were most excited to create a story with Mrs Bradbury to go into our Class R book. We decided to create a book with a collection of stories and each child contributed to their groups story and the illustrations. I know parents will be excited to see the books published.

Continuing with our dinosaur topic. We read the story "How to grow a dinosaur" by Caryl Hart. The children discussed the story before we explored the beanstalks we have been growing. The children were fascinated by how plants grow and were excited to see how tall their beanstalk was.

In PE, we have been focusing on our ball skills. The children retold the story "We're going on a bear hunt" and manipulated a ball in line with the story e.g. tip toeing on the ball.

Class 1

This week in English we have continued to read our class book 'Dogger.' We read how Dave showed Dogger some men setting up the summer fair and we wrote our own memories about a summer fair. We then thought about how special Dogger is to Dave and talked in pairs about our own favourite toys before writing sentences to describe our toys. In Maths we have been working on finding doubles and near doubles. We learnt that we could guickly add near doubles such as 4+5 by doubling one of the numbers. If we doubled the smaller number we knew to add 1 more. If we doubled the bigger number we knew to take one away. In Science this week we looked at a range of materials and sorted them to match their labels. We then tested our knowledge by naming a range of materials shown as pictures. In Theme we learnt about modern toys like the ones we have at home. We talked about how they were different from the older toys we had seen. We drew a picture of a modern toy and labelled the materials it was was made of and thought about whether it was electronic. We had a great time on World Book Day going to see the story of Jack & the Beanstalk and completing a story scavenger hunt!

Class 2

This week we continued to read our class book, 'Man on the Moon'. We learned how to fly Bob's moon rocket, writing instructions and command sentences using time words.

We had a very busy time writing poems, recipes and instructions for our class book which we did as part of our World Book Day activities. We illustrated it and added a front cover and blurb. We have used a space theme to link in with our English work.

We enjoyed starting some 'Alien art' this week. We are designing and decorating our own aliens which we hope to name and use as part of our creative writing. Then we decided to research space a little more and found out some interesting facts. We learned the names and some features of the planets in our solar system and that the moon travels around the Earth.

In Maths we completed some learning checks for addition and subtraction. We were pleased with ourselves but needed a quick recap on one or two concepts.

PE was fun as we tried to polish up our skipping skills. We are improving and learned some tricks on the big rope!









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Class 3

Class 3 have enjoyed planning characters and settings for the book they are creating ready to publish. We made the houses we had designed in Forest School, then continued editing our writing to let the readers know all about our characters. We even found links between the characters and gave them personalities. In maths we have been using our reasoning skills to solve multiplication and division problems and have been busy learning our poems ready for our Choral Speaking festival next Tuesday at the Oldham Coliseum.

Class 4

Class 4 have continued reading their book Bewilderwood this week. We have made predictions and discussed what characters are thinking. In maths we have used a formal method of multiplication and in SMSC we learnt the word 'dilemma' and thought about the difficult decisions that many children in poor countries have to make. On Wednesday we went to the forest and made some amazing 'boggle houses' linked to our English work.

Class 5

This week we have been finally getting to grips with long multiplication and are moving on to reasoning and problem solving with this. Everyone has worked hard at this all week. In English we have been finishing our diary entries and preparing best copies. During World Book Day we started work on a retelling of Ernest Shackletons' epic journey from Elephant Island to South Georgia to save his crew. We also had some super costumes and ideas on the day. Our work on this will continue next week. In Science we have been looking at Water Resistance and streamlining. We have also begun work on our America's topic in out Theme work. This is getting the class very interested.

Class 6

This week in Maths we have been using and forming algebraic equations. We have worked extremely hard to understand the concept of the letter shown and unknown value. We have also started to solve one and two-step equations and finding the unknown values. In Computing we have started our new topic: Programming A Variables. We have been introduced the the idea of a variable and that things can change depending on the algorithm given to specific objects. We have used scratch to begin to develop these ideas. In Engish we have been working in groups to write the journey of Shackleton and his men packing up Patience Camp and beginning their journey on lifeboats to Elephant Island.


Football Tournament at Manchester United

Raffle Tickets will be available to buy in the coming weeks and the winners will be picked on the day of our Easter Egg Hunt.




Classes can also wear their class chosen colour that day too (but this is not mandatory!)
