<u>Class R</u>

This week Class R have definitely had a Christmas hat on. We have been writing Christmas cards for our Year 6 buddies and carrying on with our letter writing. In Maths, we have learnt about the difference between 2D and 3D shapes. We have also learnt some of the names of 3D Shapes. Why not ask you child if they can show you a cube? We gained a new classmate - Snowy the FODS elf, who has been trying to get Edward the elf out of trouble (he is very clumsy).

In Phonics, we have learnt the red words; are and your.

<u>Class 1</u>

This week we have been completing some work for our Christmas display board and we have written some postcards from the South Pole. We tried very hard to keep our handwriting neat and within the

lines. In phonics we have learnt ai and oa and practised other sounds we know so far. In Maths we have been practising reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals and reading and writing numbers 1-20 in words. In Theme we have been learning about Antarctica and thinking about why it is too difficult for people to live there. We were thrilled to meet our class Elf this week and we have named him Ben.

<u>Class 2</u>

This week we have been finishing our Christmas display board with some lovely writing and artwork. We have also done some theme work about cold places looking at Arctic countries. We have been working hard with phonics checks and learning how to add and subtract using an empty number line. Some of us have had our first

Forest School sessions starting to make wooden reindeer decorations, it's been fantastic! The rest of us will be completing the activities next week. What a surprise we had this week when Ed the elf turned up in Class 2. He enjoyed the pears at snack time and also wrote us a letter!

<u>Class 3</u>

This week in maths we have been learning methods to help mental addition and subtraction. We have been looking at root words in English and using the prefixes super and sun. We have had a busy science week learning about types of rocks

(igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary) grouping and comparing them as well as naming them and looking at natural and human made rocks. Our new member of the class, Timmy the Elf has made us smile with his antics...we wonder what he'll get up to over the weekend?

Class 4

In maths this week we have looked at two new concepts. We worked on square numbers. We learnt that a to square a number, you multiply it by itself (for example, 6 x 6). We also worked on factor pairs, which are two numbers that, when multiplied together, total a given sum (for example, the number 20 has 3 factor pairs; 1 x 20, 2 x 10 and 4 x 5). Towards the end of the week, we briefly touched on prime numbers. In English we have been solely focussed on punctuating direct speech. We learnt about speech marks (or inverted commas) and when to include full stops, capital letters, guestion marks, exclamation marks and commas. This is an important grammar milestone for Year 4 children, and we will be revisiting it throughout the year. In Science we looked at how to protect the teeth and created a poster. In theme we tried to copy some Egyptian pattern work in pencil and crayon and in computing we continued to programme our robots.

Class 5 Christmas Song

Class 5

This week in Class 5 we have been showing lots of resilience in our Maths; where we have been learning about the long multiplication method. Some of the children have found this method particularly difficult but have not given up-

it is something we will re-cap again in a few weeks. In English the children have continued to look at the text of 'The Arrival' where they have put together a sequence of pictures and discussed to correct order of events. The children have then thought carefully about how the young girl might have felt at different points in the sequence. In Theme, we have research Oskar Schindler and learnt about his impact on helping to save Jews from the Concentration camps during World War Two.

Class 6

In maths this week, we have been working on angles. We have had to find missing angles in triangles and use our reasoning skills to find missing angles when there is more than one. We have also been working out missing angles on a straight line and in a full turn and learning that opposite angles are equal. In English, we have written a narrative to

accompany a series of images. Before we wrote our narratives, we discussed the emotions that were felt in each image and then incorporated this into our writing. We have written our winter poems up for our winter display board. We have also spent time this week filming our Christmas video and have made Christmas cards which will be given to our buddies next week.

Forest School

Class 2 have had their first Forest School sessions this week. We've had a great time making these fantastic reindeer. The rest of Class 2 will be doing the activity next week. Even our class elf, Ed came out to enjoy the fun.

The snow scuppered Y3's attempts to get outside with City in the Community this afternoon, so while the snow thickened outside, Class 3 and Matthew from City in the Community used the Commando Joes equipment to practice skills in the classroom. Northern Roots Bike Hub & Trails Consultation

'The Northern Roots Bike Hub is a fantastic opportunity to develop a safe environment for cycling and other outdoor activities. It will attract local families and children to enjoy top class facilities and give everyone a safe place to be more active. Let's all get involved in this survey, make our voices heard and push for this amazing opportunity for our local town' Matt Walls, GB Cycling Team & Oldham resident

Northern Roots is proposing to create a FUN, audacious, state of the art Bike Hub & Trails facility on the Northern Roots site. Building on creative ideas that came out of the mountain biking consultation we ran earlier this year, we need your help to shape and develop it! What would YOU like to use, learn, operate or create at the Bike Hub?

The proposed Bike Hub & Trails facilities will include:

A Pump Track, with start hill and slope and a circuit of rollers, banked turns, jumps and differing features along the track line, allowing for a diversity of riders with different skill levels.

A Duel Track, consisting of 2 riding lines running side by side with mirroring features and lengths. Testing the speed and bike handling skills of two cyclists at the same time will speed up progression as riders push themselves to get better and beat their friends.

A Skills Area, including short trail sections with boulders, wooden skinnies, ladders, dirt and wooden jumps, reflecting natural obstacles a rider can expect to encounter whist mountain biking, and allowing riders to practise balance, body positioning, and manoeuvres.

The Bike Hub facilities would include a refreshments Kiosk with viewing platform, bike shop, repairs and hire, bike wash and shower facilities.

These facilities would be complemented by an **extensive events and engagement programme** in partnership with a range of organisations and include activities like learn to ride and improvers' sessions, competitive cycling events, and Club and holiday club activities.

Existing mountain bike trails on the Northern Roots site will be restored, and new graded mountain bike trails will fan out across the site, through its woodland areas.
