Class R

This week in Class R we have been going coronation mad!! Coronation is our word of the week and we started our week by talking about what a coronation is and why we are having one. The children really enjoyed learning the story 'The King's Pants' by Nicholas Allan and designing a new pair of pants for King Charles. The children also had a fab time making flags and crowns for our parade and using blue, red and white icing for some Union Jack biscuit decorating.

On open day it was great to share some of our coronation activities with our Class R parents. The children created a kings head silhouette painting with rollers and masking tape to create some funky patterns. They also built a castle using crates and our den building equipment.

This week in Maths, we have been focusing on 3D shapes. We went on a 3D shape hunt around the classroom and built castles and towers using the different 3D shapes. We also discussed the difference between 2D and 3D and some children were able to recount using technology that plays or creates 3D images.

This week has also been gymnastics week for Class R. The children practiced jumping, balancing and rolling with various gymnastics equipment. When learning the new skills the children demonstrated strength, control and balance.

Finally, the children really had a good time at Wacky Races, organised by FODS. The children celebrated by jumping on Mrs Bradbury after giving the winning team a big round of applause.

Class 1

This week in English we have started our own fact files about the Great Fire of London. We looked at the features of a fact file and then used shared writing to write an example introduction and a section about how the fire spread. We then wrote our first drafts of these sections in our books. In Maths we have continued our work on multiplication and division looking at counting in 5s, recognising and adding equal groups and describing and drawing arrays. In Science we started our topic about plants. We each planted a broad bean seed and talked about what we thought they needed to grow. We set up some test pots to find out if seeds need soil, light and water. We will monitor the growth of our seeds over the next few weeks. We had a lovely time on Thursday at our open day when family members came to join us for some coronation themed craft activities. We enjoyed making crowns, flags, paper chains and royal collages. On Friday we also enjoyed dressing up in red white and blue and had a picnic style lunch and some of us took part in the coronation wacky races event after school.

Class 2

This week we had lots of fun getting ready to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III. We enjoyed having our friends and family visit the classroom during our Open Day on Thursday when they helped us with lots of coronation craft activities. A big thank you to all those who were able to join us. We made crowns to wear during our party lunch, union flag bunting, whirling windmills, coronation wreaths and the longest paper chain you could imagine! Our classroom looked very bright and colourful. The weather was a bit unpredictable on Friday so we enjoyed our party lunch altogether in the classroom. Some of us took part in the Coronation Wacky Races event after school which we all really enjoyed. We also began to learn a new theme song this week called 'Fire, fire everywhere', which tells what happened as the Great Fire of London spread. We discovered that some of the notes and the rhythms in the song sounded like sirens we might hear today. We used percussion to create our own siren sounds to accompany the song. In Maths, we continued to work on our times tables especially counting in 5's and 10's and looking for patterns. English work focused on independent writing and making sure we are checking secure spellings, punctuation and presentation.









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Class 3

In Science this week, Class 3 have been considering meals that athletes would eat before and after competing, considering the different food groups. We have also looked at how blood and oxygen is transported around the body and the effect of movement and exercise on our pulse. In maths we have looked at fractions, particularly equivalent fractions. We have written a story in 3 parts over the week based on a magic carpet adventure and travels around the world. We loved having the parents in during Open Day and have had a wonderful time with coronation activities and then the Wacky Races / Disco. Thanks FODS

Class 4

In theme this week, we looked at Ordnance Survey (or OS) maps. After studying the symbols and abbreviations, we created our own villages and used the OS examples for inspiration. In SMSC we looked at why people may borrow money, and in maths we converted mixed numbers to improper fractions, and back again. We loved the open day and Thursday, and it was great to see so many adults in our classroom. We continued our athletics unit in PE and found time to do plenty of coronation craft activities too!

Class 5

It has been a short but eventful week. Thanks to all the parent s who came in to take part in our art. We really enjoyed you joining us. In our English we have been writing about the Anglo Saxons as part of our work linked to our novel. It was the Saxons who taught the Badlanders all about the monsters. In maths some of us were investigating probability with dice as well as the class brushing up on our arithmetic. We also began our Science work on habitats. In theme we researched cities of the Americas looking at climate and biomes.

Class 6

This week we have recapped how to find percentages of numbers and the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages and towards the end of the week we have focused on finding angles in triangles, quadrilaterals and polygons. In English we have recapped the use of subordinate clauses, hyphens and reminded ourselves on the different terms of simple past, past perfect and past progressive as well as the present tense, present progressive and present perfect. We had a lovely day on Thursday for open day and really enjoyed creating our different pieces of artwork and sharing our time with the parents who were able to attend.
