Class R

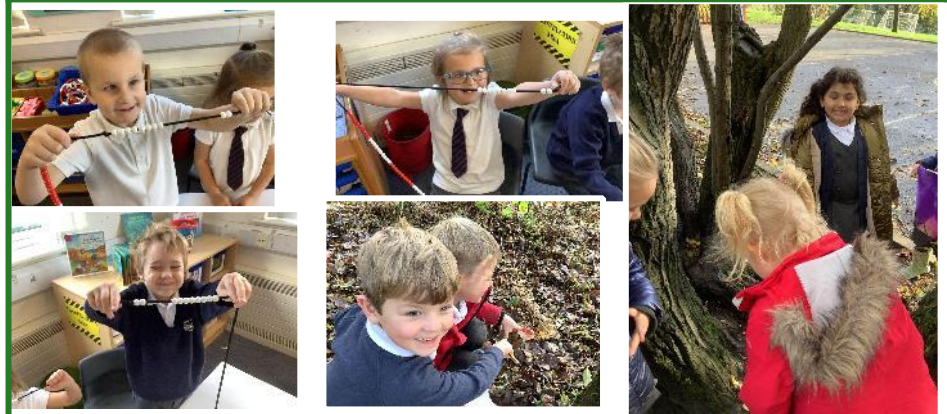
In Class R we have started our new topic Fairy Tales! We have read the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and retold it using sensory objects. We have also made our own three bears cottage in our classroom. In Maths, we have practiced using our counting rules to make porridge, counting the scoops of porridge, squirts of golden syrup, amount of fruit and how long we needed to put it in the microwave. In Phonics, we have learnt our new sounds, 'c', 'k', 'u' and 'b'. In PE, we pretended to be fireworks and practiced throwing things into the air to make a BANG! To further celebrate Bonfire Night we watched a firework display and discussed the colours and noises. In RE, we discussed friendships and how to make friends, we even looked at story characters who are good friends.

Class 1

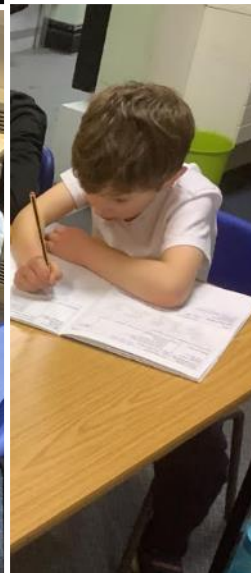
This week in English we have started a new story called Lost and Found. We looked at the picture on the first page of the book and made predictions about what the suitcase might mean. We used hot seating to explore the little boy's thoughts at seeing a penguin on his doorstep and wrote our ideas in a thought bubble. We considered how the penguin might be feeling and wrote words to describe his emotions. We also wrote about how the little boy could help the penguin. In Maths we have been working on our number bonds to 5, 10 and 20. We have enjoyed using cubes and beadstrings to work out what goes with each number to complete the number bonds. In Theme we started our new topic about Cold Places. We looked at a map of the world and identified the hot and cold parts in particular the North and South Pole and the Equator. In Science we learnt about seasonal change by going on an Autumn Walk. We were surprised how many signs of autumn we found around the school grounds.

Class 2

Class 2 continued to learn about materials and their properties in our Science work this week. We focused on plastic and investigated why plastic can be a problem and what we can do about it. We also found out about the differences between card and paper. We 'virtually' visited a paper mill to see the process from tree to paper! In our maths work this week we have done learning checks to see how well we can use different strategies to add and subtract and we also checked our knowledge of 2D and 3D shape. We have enjoyed starting our 'Mastering Number' activities which have really helped us with number bonds this week. In phonics we have learned how to use split digraphs to read and spell words which have these in them. We started a new story called 'Ten Little Lights' which we used to help us with writing super sentences this week. We also read about bonfire safety and how we can enjoy bonfire night safely. On Friday we had our first PE lesson with CITC. We had fun with some new games and kept fit.

Class 3

This week Class 3 were learning how to write a newspaper report. We looked at different newspaper articles identifying different features such as headlines, by lines and captions. We then wrote our own articles about floods in Saddleworth before presenting them in a newspaper style using columns.

In maths, we have been learning how to do formal multiplication in columns after practising and improving our tables knowledge. In art, we learnt how to produce different shades from one pencil then investigated shades from softer pencils before using these to sketch pebbles.

Class 4

We started our new 'Animals Including Humans' topic in science this week by drawing what we thought the digestive system looked like. We then learnt the 14 different parts and labelled them on a diagram. In theme, we focussed on floods in our 'What Makes the Earth Angry?' topic by writing a newspaper report. In English we started *The Incredible Book Eating Boy* and we had fun with comprehension at the start of the week before moving on to using and punctuating speech marks. We learnt the terms 'factors' and 'square numbers' in maths and we moved onto using Google Docs in our ICT lesson.

Class 5

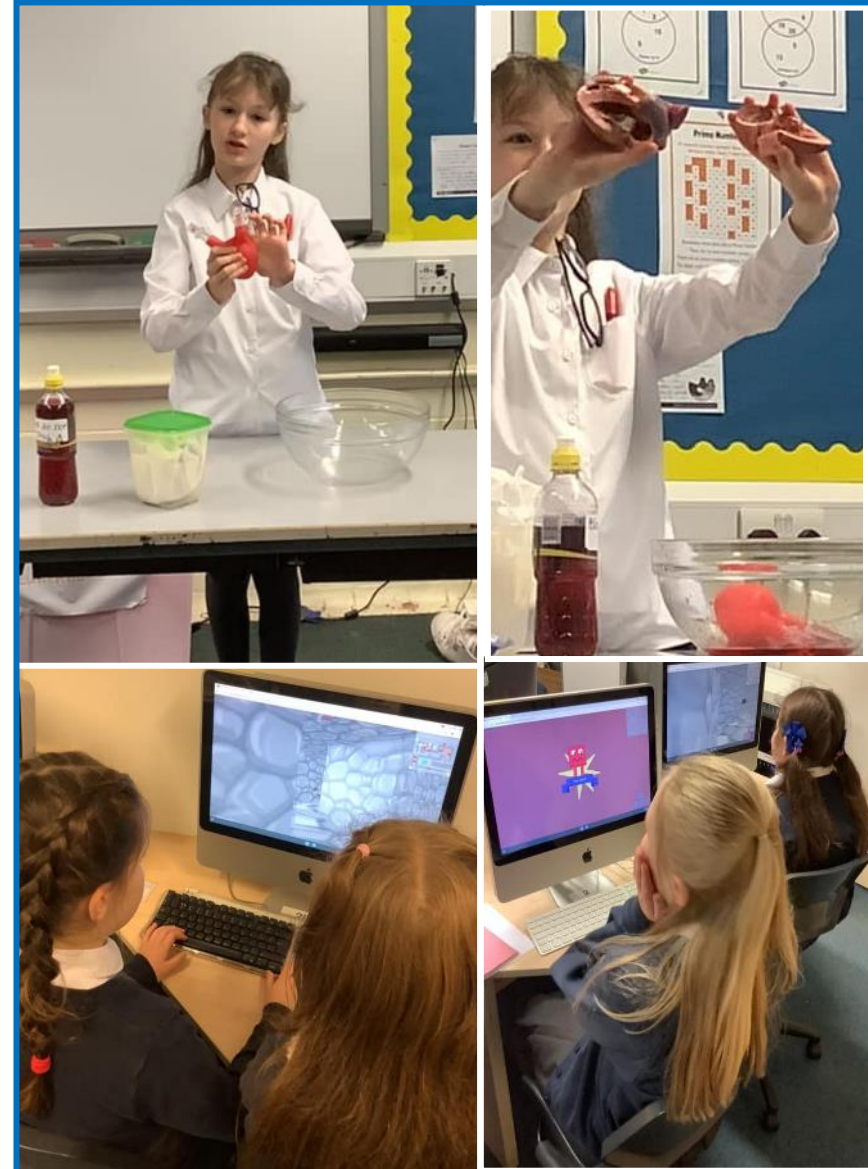

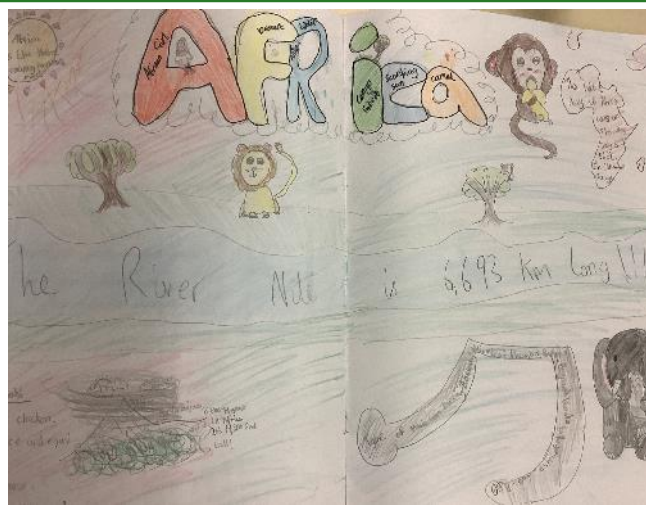
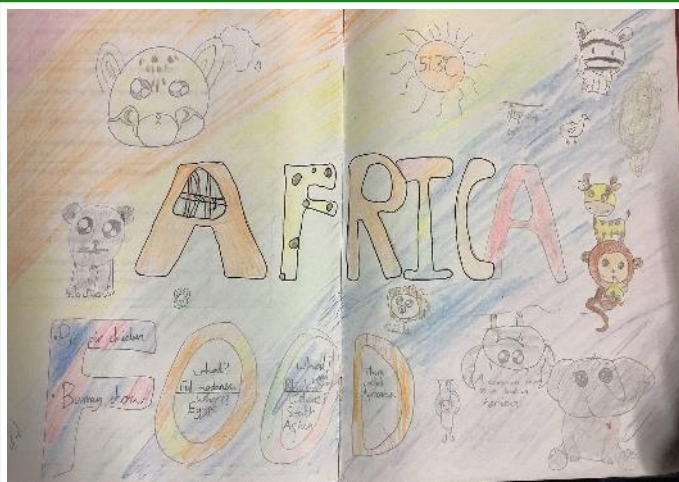
Class 6
