Class R

This week Class R have been super busy as they were introduced to Forest School! They have spent the week exploring the outdoor forest area, building homes for small magical people and collecting fire breath which the Dragons left behind! We then used the fire breath we found to make friendship bracelets. We also was introduced to the school dog Shen, we loved throwing the ball for her and playing outside.

In Maths, we have been learning our number bonds to 10! We have learnt a new rhyme which helps us to remember. We used this rhyme to play a matching game, where the children had to match up with another child to make a perfect 10. In Literacy, we have followed on with our Space topic and read the story 'Aliens Love Underpants.' We have learnt about new patterns, such as spirals, checked, zig zags, stripes and polka dots, using these to decorate our own pair of underpants! We hung these up on a washing line in the classroom, hoping the Aliens would come and visit. Following this on, in Phonics we practiced our sounds by labelling objects in the classroom with post it notes, just so the Alien knew what everything is when he visits. We have also been practicing our capital letter sounds and formation. In PE, we have been pretending to be Pirates, scrubbing the deck, walking the plank and finding the treasure.

Class 1

This week in English we have continued to read our class text 'The Naughty Bus'. We have looked at the way the bus moved through the house and generated suitable movement verbs in a mind map. We used these in full sentences to describe how the bus moved. We then looked at adding prepositions such as over, under, next to, around, down, across to our sentences to explain how and where the bus moved through the house and garden.

In Maths we have been consolidating our addition and subtraction skills focusing on number to 20. We have practised different ways of working out the answer including using cubes, number lines and mental calculations. In Science this week we checked on the growth of our bean plants and were surprised at how tall some were already. Then we went outside to complete a wild plant hunt. We used a tally to count how many times we saw each different wild plant. The most common was the daisy! In Theme we learnt about the history of the car. It was interesting to find out that the earliest car had no roof, windscreen, or headlights. We compared the features of an early car and a modern car by labelling a diagram of them.

Class 2

This week we have been working on lots of different maths skills covering reasoning and calculations. We have worked with and without equipment and reasoning work has included work on shape, time and fractions. We have also continued our maths 'busy books', consolidating and practising maths skills. In Mastering number sessions we recapped that numbers 11-19 are composed of '10 and a bit' by making them on the rekenrek in a variety of ways. This showed that these numbers sit between 10 and 20 on the number line so we used empty number lines and tried to put them in the correct places. In English work we used the story of Fe Fi Fo Fum to write a letter to Wolfie asking him to stop his bad behaviour and suggesting how he could try harder to be nice! We also looked at how to spell contracted words and use them in our writing. In reading comprehension we read the story of My big brother JJ and learned about the job of a cowboy. This week we have also begun to find out more about Queen Elizabeth II as we make a start to some of our jubilee celebration activities.





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Class 3

In English this week, Class 3 used their text 'The BFG' to look at some rules for adding suffixes to root words. We also picked out descriptions for characters, hunting out the phrases and words the author had used, to be able to draw them. In Maths, we have been learning about tenths; counting on and back in tenths, ordering, converting into improper fractions and back and introducing the decimal point. In science we have learnt the names and function of the main bones of the human skeleton. We had fun in ICT coding and creating our own programs to make objects move, disappear or make sounds.

Class 4

Class 4 have been coding in our ICT lessons this week. We have used the 2Code page on Purple Mash to input basic commands which make our avatars move direction. In science we talked about the dangers of electricity and studied the difference between mains and battery appliances. In SMSC we looked at different ways to pay, and discussed debit and credit cards, bank accounts and contactless payments. In maths we have been dividing decimal numbers by 10 and 100 and in ENglish we continued our Roald Dahl; book *The Witches*.

Class 5

In maths we have been comparing and ordering fractions less than one, we had to work on recapping the greater than and less than signs to build our confidence in this. In English we have learnt about homophones as part of our SPaG focus and continued to research information for our non-chronological reports. In Theme we have researched Queen Victoria and looked at the countries which were part of the British Empire.


Class 6

In Class 6 this week we have practised some SPaG questions in preparation for next week. We have enjoyed learning about out new Theme- The Victorians; we have plotted events from the time in chronological order on a Timeline; researched and located countries which were part of the British Empire during Queen Victoria's reign and researched the Queen herself- finding 10 interestings facts. We have also explored and used scratch again to try and create a particular game. In PE, we continued with rounders; learning the roles of bowler, backstop and first base and then put these into practise in a game situation.

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Music Lessons from September

Children in Year 1- Year 5 will have the opportunity over the coming weeks to sign up for music lessons in the to start in September. The music teachers will be demonstrating the instruments available, and a letter will go out by email on early next week with an expression of interest form re new music lessons.

Existing players will receive a separate letter to sign up for another year of music lessons from September. Children in Year 6 will need to sign up with their new secondary schools should they wish to continue.

Learning music is a very valuable and rewarding activity which can continue throughout education and into adulthood, however it requires commitment, resilience and perseverance from both the child and the parent.
