<u>Class R</u>

Our *Autumn* topic continued this week with a focus on leaves. The children have been brilliant collecting as many leaves as they could, and we have looked at their size, shape and colour.

In the creative area we have used playdough to create a tree full of leaves, we have threaded leaves using pipe cleaner and we have made leaf handprints for our autumn display.

For maths this week we have looked at size, mass and capacity. We have compared different objects to see which is the biggest and which is the heaviest.

In phonics we have learned the sounds i, n, p and g. The children's writing is really coming along. We also carried out a little assessment to see what other sounds the children know.

Our reading area is now covered with camouflage netting and fake leaves to give it that autumn feel. This week we have read *We're going on a leaf hunt, Tree* and *Leaf Man.*

We have also watched a few episodes of *Peter Rabbit* while having our snack break (and talked about why squirrels bury their nuts) and fit in some PE with Aimee and some yoga.

<u>Class 1</u>

This week in English we have continued reading our story 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch.' We have written a description of Mrs Grinling, a thought bubble for Mr Grinling, we have selected words to describe Mr Grinling and designed our own sandwich to feed the the seagulls and listed the ingredients. In Maths we have continued our work on addition and subtraction. We have learnt about number sentences and fact families for addition as well as the number bonds to 10. In Theme we looked at the differences between the seaside in the past and present. We sorted images according to when we thought they were taken. In Science we have learnt about our sense of smell. We learnt the names of the parts of the nose and found out a little about how our sense of smell works. We then carried out some tests using smelling pots. We smelled each pot and identified which scent it was. In P.E. we worked on our change of direction and agility. We played the bean game and completed some team relays such as collecting cones and egg and spoon.

Class 2

This week in Maths we have been comparing numbers, using our knowledge of place value and our numberline skills. We have used the words greater than, less than and equals and the Maths signs which go with them. We have continued our 'Beside the Seaside' theme by using atlases to label a map of the United Kingdom with the countries, capitals and seas. We have learnt that a seaside resort is always on the coast. In art we have completed our pictures of a lighthouse in a stormy sea by using pastels and coloured pencils.

In English we have written letters to Mrs Grinling from The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch with some good ideas to put in Mr Grinling's Lunch basket. During our P.E. we have continued to practise throwing and catching a ball or beanbag, using both an under and over-arm throw.

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Class 3

This week in maths, Class 3 have used their place value knowledge to look at how the columns change when we add 1s, 10s or 100s without crossing into the next column. In English, we have been thinking about the poems we read last week and using our learning about poetry features, to write our own narrative or shape poem about a volcano. We are going to share these with Class 4 in a class book. In science, we looked at how igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary rocks are formed and learned the names of some rocks from

these groups. In theme, we looked at how tsunamis are linked to earthquakes; how they are formed, consequences and how to stay safe if one is predicted. We have looked at different jobs in SMSC and qualities needed for them.

Class 4

This week, we have continued with our Volcanic poetry. We have learnt about personification and written our drafts in order to create a class book of volcanic poetry. In maths, we have focused on rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. We had a joint computing and science lesson this week, using music software to experiment with pitch and sound duration. Our SMSC question for the week is 'what makes a good relationship?' and we looked at friendships and played a game called anonymous friend. Finally, in PE we continued our work on scanning, dodging and moving into a space. The children also had a go at creating fantasy teams and talking about what skills defenders and offenders need.

<u>Class 5</u>

This week in English Class 5 have been writing their own chapter of the Beowulf story. We have been focussing on using similes, metaphors, personification and alliteration. We have created our own Gillian for Beowulf to take on. In Maths this week our main focus has been solving multistep problems involving addition and subtraction. In P.E. we have been looking at attacking and defending, more specifically how to trick a defender.

<u>Class 6</u>

This week in Class 6 we have continued to learn about Beowulf's fearless determination to fight off the foul fiend-Grendel. We have thought about how he might feel the night before he meets this foe and have written diary entries as Beowulf, trying to include thoughts and feeling as well as recounting events in order. In Maths we have been looking at addition, subtraction and have looked at the rules of divisibility, using our reasoning skills to find the answers to questions more easily. In Science, we have learnt about Carl Linnaeus and how he created a system to classify animals, we also had a go at using this tiered system to find the names of specific animals. School Meals

The menu for school dinners is on the school website -

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

Music Lessons

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence.
