Class R

This week Class R have focused on 'transitioning' and that has been our word of the week. We discussed what 'transitioning' means and examples in nature we have already learnt about, for example a larvae transition into a ladybird or a baby transitioning into a child. In the areas of provision, we started to transition some of the toys ready for the new children and we put boxes in our role play area to role play moving house.

We then discussed a transition happening in school - Class R becoming Class 1. The children thought of how transitioning to year 1 made them feel and we thought of questions to ask Mrs Mellor on move up day.

To help Mrs Mellor know more about the class, we wrote some information about ourselves on butterflies. Things like our favourite thing to do at school and who our friends are. It was also a chance for Mrs Mellor to see our wonderful writing. On Friday, we also had another exciting event. Some police horses came to visit school! The children were able to use the knowledge they gained from our topic 'Real Heroes' to ask questions to the trainers and showed good listening when around the animals.

In Maths, we practiced our number formation and our addition and subtraction skills. We read the story 'How Many Legs' and had to create parties that had a certain number of legs. The children also built the tallest towers and practiced their mathematical vocabulary for measuring length.

Class R had a super day in Class 1 with Mrs Mellor, creating our finger paint butterflies and exploring the areas of provision in Class 1. All the children seem really excited for the next step in their educational journey.

Class 1

This week in English we have been learning about prefixes and suffixes. We learnt how the prefix un changes the meaning of adjectives to the opposite. We learnt how adding the suffix ing to the end of a word changes it to mean it is happening now. We also used the suffixes er and est to compare two or more things. We had fun thinking of our own sentences using these comparisons. In Maths we have completed our work on time and have been working on assessments of our summer units of work. In Theme we compared our own lives to that of a child in the Maasai tribe. We considered similarities and differences between our homes, clothes, schools, food and games.

In Computing we have been learning about digital writing using a word processor. We have investigated what particular keys on the keyboard do such as the space bar, return key and delete key. We have practised finding letters on the keyboard to type words and learnt how to save our work.

We had a super day on Thursday in Class 2 for Move up day. We made kindness buckets and each received a kindness gem.

On Friday we had a amazing visit from the police horses. They were huge! We found out lots about the job they do and how they are looked after.

Class 2

In Maths this week, Class 2 have revisited Place Value in our maths learning. To help us we used number tracks, tens grids, our rekenreks and fingers! We wrote with words and numerals and used base 10 apparatus to make numbers and solve simple problems.

In English we used a camping picture to discuss things we might do during the holidays. We used the picture as the basis for a short story trying to use different features of writing.

In reading, we learned more about how to spot inference in simple texts and polished up our text detective skills.

We had a great day on 'Move up' day with Mrs Spencer in Class 3. We made posters, played games and found out about what it will be like in Key Stage 2 next term!

Class 3

This week Class 3 have been learning about different time zones in the world; how it works and why they are needed. We have looked at places around the world and compared their times to those in the UK. This has linked nicely to our Maths topic on time where we have been learning to tell the time to 5 minutes; considering to and past the hour and also using Roman Numerals to 12. We have also been learning about countries in the Arctic, doing our own research to find out about these to produce a poster or leaflet using our non-fiction writing features.

Class 4

Class 4 looked at different families in their SMSC lesson this week. We listed all of the different possible relations and explained the meanings of blended families, step and half brothers and sisters, single-parent families and same-sex partnerships. We then produced a poster explaining that love connects all of these. In English we continued to plan our final big write of the year and in maths we continued telling the time by looking at analogue clocks when the minute hand has gone past half past.

Class 5

Our Main focus this week has been on our Mayans topic. We have looked at the Mayan number system, which did need some extra thinking as it was so unfamiliar to us! We also have looked at historical evidence and how the Mayans were rediscovered in the 19th century. In Maths we have looked at angle within 2d shapes, 2d shape itself and 3d shapes. The class got to grips with this very well. We also continued our novel "The Boy with One Name" and are getting close to the climax of the book. Jones and Ruby have just caught a gast or ghost! We also continued with our tennis skills. W also got to do handball!

Class 6

CLass 6 have continued to work hard on producing items for their Business Challenge sale next week- we do hope some of you can make it to buy some of our products. We have continued to read the book 'Wonder' and have discussed a raise of different topics when they have arisen; thinking carefully about how different situations were dealt with and the impact this might have had on others. In PE we have enjoyed playing rounders and Handball this week, working well in different teams to play games with different rules.


