# **Class R**

In maths this week, we have been looking at numbers up to 5. We have learnt to represent the numbers on our fingers and using apparatus. We have also tried to subitise numbers (recognising the amount without counting) and even found time to add and subtract 1.

Our nativity practice is now in full swing as we prepare for the big day on Tuesday 19th December. A few costumes are coming in and we know it will be amazing once we have put the finishing touches to it. The songs are sounding great and the acting is fantastic.

We have read the books *Arctic Song, Little Penguin Lost* and *The First Christmas.* The reading corner has also undergone a dramatic change too. No longer an autumn camouflage den, it is now an amazing gingerbread house!

In the creative areas we have practised our scissor technique by cutting out snowmen (after building a few ourselves outdoors) and sticking different clothes on them. We also made some beautiful Christmas cards which will be coming home soon, and had some great fun using potatoes to paint some Christmas lights.

# RECEPTION CLASS TRIP TO SEE THE SNOWMAN

The children in Class R were walking on air on Tuesday when they attended a screening of The Snowman at Oldham's Queen Elizabeth Hall. This was no ordinary screening however, as it included a full, live orchestra, which the children loved. There was even a visit from The Snowman himself.

All the staff who accompanied the children were hugely proud as the children behaved impeccably throughout the whole trip, including on the bus. The bus ride also gave us a chance to practice our phonics as we played I-Spy.

# Class 1

This week in Maths we have started our unit on place value within 20. We have learnt about the structure of the teen numbers including how many tens and ones each of these numbers has. We have looked at matching up the numerals and words for the numbers between 10 and 20 as well as practising how to spell these number words. We noticed that thirteen and fifteen are trickier because they don't have the three or the five as part of their name.

In English we have been re telling the story of Lost and Found using our own sentences and including time adverbials to show when things happened. We have tried hard with capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In Theme we learnt about the towns and cities in the Arctic Circle. We looked at how many people lived there and learnt the word population. We noticed that all the cities in the arctic circle had fewer people than Manchester and we talked about why this might be. We looked at photographs of cities such as Barrow in Alaska and Tromso in Norway. We identified the different human features in these places. We have spent time this week practising our songs and poems for our Christmas show and we were surprised when our class elf arrived on Monday. We named him Mario!

# Class 2

This week in Maths class two have added and subtracted two digit numbers. We have found out mystery numbers from whole part models and bar models.

In Theme we have continued to learn about the Arctic. We found out that the Arctic doesn't have spring or autumn and on some days it is always dark but for other days it is always light. We have also looked at the human features found in different Arctic towns. We have used ipads to find out information about Arctic animals and used this information to create fact files in our writing lessons. In P.E we have been dodging our partner whilst bouncing a ball, this was not easy!

Class two have also been visited by a very happy elf. I wonder what he will get up to next?









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# Class 3

This week, Class 3 enjoyed a frosty morning in **Forest School**, working in groups to produce some wonderful Christmas trees which are now hanging up in the forest.

In maths, we began our new unit on multiplication and division; grouping, sharing and looking at arrays and in English we wrote out in neat and sent our letters to the staff of Creswell Crags to let them know how much we had enjoyed our visit. We have also used our writing in theme, to compare Stone Age and modern houses and are now moving on to The Bronze Age.

We have been busy investigating materials in science, predicting which would be magnetic, learning only metal is, then investigating metals further to learn that not all metals are magnetic. In Computing, we refined our animations from last week and we learnt about what we could do to help with injuries and emergencies in SMSC. What a busy week!

# Class 4

This week Class 4 are continuing to look at multiplication and division. We have investigated the 7, 11 and 12 times tables and looked at how to use base 10 to support our learning. In English and Theme, we have been learning about Stone Age tools and weapons. The children were able to use the knowledge they gained from our trip last week to Creswell Crags, as well as research some information themselves. The children then produced a nonchronological report on Stone Age tools and weapons. The children also demonstrated their theme homework from this half term, by trying to sell their Stone Age weapons to the class. The children really enjoyed talking about how many pieces of flint they could afford! In Gymnastics, we finished our movement skills with handstands and began to plan a gymnastics routine of a Stone Age hunt ready to film next week. In science, we discussed features of habitats and how animals have adapted to live in different in different habitats.

### Class 5

This week in class 5 we have been writing a balanced argument, we first looked at the features of an argument then we researched different causes of the Titanic crash. We looked at persuasive writing and the type of languages used to convey opinions. In Maths we have finished off our fractions topic by looking at subtracting mixed numbers. In science class 5 conducted an experiment to investigate the impact of air resistance. In Theme we used atlases to find the countries in the British Empire during the Victorian period.

### Class 6

This week in English we have been looking at a balanced argument and understanding that there are two sides of an argument that need to be looked at and discussed. After looking at an example of a balanced argument, we have researched other possible causes for the Titanic disaster and we have thought carefully about the language, tone and vocabulary that we have used. In SMSC we have started to look at the topic 'Our World' we have looked at how we can be a responsible global citizen and also learnt about global warming and the impact it is having on Earth, we have also discussed ways in which we can try to help prevent this from getting worse.




I know the picture is not too good, apologies for that, but please see below Alfie's review. As my photography is not the best, I've taken the liberty of typing the whole review...

### **School Meals**

The menu for school dinners is on the school website - https://www.diggleschool.co.uk/school-meals

The amazing kitchen staff provide a wide range of tasty meals throughout the week, with 3 options to choose from most days, and all dietary requirements will be catered for.

Meals are charged at £2.60 for years 3-6 unless eligible for Free School Meals. If you pay for your child's dinners the easiest way to make sure you don't fall behind with payments is to set up the "Auto Top-Up", which automatically adds an amount set by you when the balance drops below a certain amount.

If your child doesn't usually have school meals and wants to try, they just need to order on the day. We are very flexible regarding children mixing school dinners and packed lunches if there are certain days they like the menu choice and not others.

### **Music Lessons**

Music lessons have commenced, and fees are now on Parent Pay. Please note that Singing lessons will not start again until after half term and the charge on Parent Pay reflects this planned absence.

Lessons will be as follows:

Thursday - Guitar

Please ensure your child brings their instrument with them where applicable on the day stated above.

We believe this is because the pop-up adverts are aimed at the registered user of the account. So if you are a 35 year old adult, who is letting your child access their social media account, your child could be seeing adverts suitable for a 35 year old adult. This may well include graphic content.

We cannot stress enough that you should not be letting your child access ANY social media channels. For your reference the minimum age restrictions are given below.

FACEBOOK - 13 years of age. TIK TOK - 13 years of age.

**SNAPCHAT - 13** years of age. THREADS - 12 years of age.

You receive a fake email receipt/invoice that appears to be from the website you've purchased from or the payment service used to make your purchase. The email address domain doesn't match that of the genuine senders.
