What have we learnt?

KS1

<u>Class R</u> This week we have been looking at all things zoo. We started looking at a new topic book 'Poo in the Zoo' by Steve Smallman and the children had lots of fun creating their own zoos at home and some animals masks. The children have also been researching different animals you might find at the zoo, through the Chester Zoo - Zoo Days videos, and drawing and labelling their favourite animals. Lastly the children have been preparing for VE Day by making or putting up bunting and preparing a tea party to have with their family and teddies. Thanks again for all the wonderful pictures and videos of your learning Class R. Keep up the good work!

Class 1 This week in Theme we have been learning about early locomotives. We found out about the life of George Stephenson and his most famous invention-The Rocket and wrote a diary entry as if we were taking our first ride on a steam train in 1830. We also wrote a newspaper report about the Rainhill Trials and how the Rocket was the only engine to finish. In Maths we have been working on fact families, addition and subtraction on BBC bitesize as well as working on our own targets in Maths Whizz. In English we have read more of the Naughty Bus and have completed some vocabulary and comprehension tasks. We have ended the week learning about VE Day and making decorations and food to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of it.

Class 2 This week Class 2 have continued their history theme about travel and transport by investigating cars old and new. They looked at how cars have changed through the years from the very earliest steam carriages right up to cars of today. They also had a challenge to make an old or new model car, we have had some great pictures. Maths this week has focussed on Maths Whizz but were very impressed last week how hard children worked with Mastery challenges for money and change using BBC Bitesize maths. Our spelling focus has looked at alternative ways to spell the long vowel sounds oo and ow. We finished our week with finding out about VE day and trying out some VE day activities including making special VE day 'Great British Bunting' to display at home, designing a poster to share the good news or even setting out your own *in-house tea party and inviting everyone who lives in your house (toys included)*.

KS2

<u>Class 3</u> This week we have been completed a VE wordsearch making flags and bunting for VE day and some of us have made scones. We have written diary extracts as Sophie and also the Giant from BFG and had fun using Giant Speak. In Maths, we revisited addition and subtraction in the form of word problems and used Purple Mash to support our maths learning.

Class 4 We did some problem solving this week in maths by solving The Great Diggle Race conundrum this week. We had to work out the finishing position of all the teachers' cars based on clues. We created a symbol to represent peace and forgiveness for Mrs Cocker's RE work and we recapped the meaning of evaporation and condensation in science. In English we finished another chapter of *The Witches* and we produced a mini-project on the county of Kent (which is where the boy and his Grandmother live). Thursday was all about VE day and we had fun creating secret coded messages, making a delicious street-party menu and filling in a 1945 map of Europe with Allies and Axis countries.

<u>Class 5</u> This week, children have continued to read the book, 'The Boy with One Name'. They were asked to write their own postcard from Jones' parents. They were also asked to write a description of Maitland's house - they were asked to use different strategies and techniques as well as some conversation. They then had to edit these descriptions to improve their writing. Class 5 have also spent some time on Maths Whizz and have completed their weekly mini-maths

<u>Class 6</u> This week, children have been asked to read more of our class book, 'The Girl of Ink and Stars'. From this, they had to answer questions based on what they have read and draw their interpretation of a Tibicenas (a creature that attacked villagers) based on a description they have read. They were also asked to research and draw constellations of stars and try to spot these in the evening. In maths, they were completed work on simplifying fractions as well as adding and subtracting fractions.




