Class R

This week in Class R, following our superhero topic, we have been identifying how we can be super in school. We discussed how we can be resilient, respectful and responsible. We then recapped our memory on the story 'Supertato' and identified all the food mentioned in the story. After this, we discussed which food is healthy and not healthy, making our own lunch boxes. In Phonics, we have been introduced to our new friend Fred! We learnt that Fred can only speak in sounds so we have to blend them together, we practiced this alot. In Maths, Class R have been exploring the number 3 and repeated patterns. We went into the forest to find natural resources to make our own patterns. We used twigs, sticks, stones, pine cones, shells, leaves and grass. In RE, we have been learning about the Quran and discussing stories which have rules we need to follow in school and in life. Finally, we have been practicing some relaxation techniques for when we feel overwhelmed, like deep breathing and meditation.

Class 1

This week in English we have continued reading our story - The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch. We have practised retelling the story and have become very familiar with the order of events. We wrote a description of Mrs Grinling and a thought bubble for Mr Grinling to show what he was thinking when the seagulls stole his lunch. In Maths we have been learning about measures. We have looked at the vocabulary longer, shorter, taller, heavier and lighter and have used this to compare the length, height and weight of a range of objects. In Theme we have learnt about the Seaside in the past. We learnt about bathing machines and punch and judy shows. We found out that people used to wear different clothes for the beach but some things have continued such as donkey rides and building sandcastles.

Class 2

This week in Class 2 we have been doing lots of writing. We made address spirals and decorated them ready to hang in the classroom. Some of us had very long addresses! We have written about what we do on different days of the week, spelling accurately and remembering to use capital letters. We went on an early Autumn walk which helped us to write some 'pick and mix' list poems using descriptive phrases and we wrote and corrected Autumn sentences. We have begun to learn a song about Autumn called 'Cauliflowers Fluffy', adding our own actions. In our maths work we looked at how a 100 square is just a very big number line but organised differently. We 'jumped' along a number line in steps of 2, 5 and 10 and did the same on the 100 square. Our focus phonics this week have been ow, oi, er and air. We have read and written real and nonsense words and had fun learning sounds again with Geraldine the giraffe. Thinking about our 6R's we have tried to be more **responsible** this week.







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Class 3

This week Class 3 have been learning about Stone Age homes and Skara Brae. We have also been finding out what an archaeologist is and how artefacts can help us learn about the past. In maths we have been using place value to add and subtract. We also enjoyed a session practising or competing against each other on TTRockstars. In science we have carried out an investigation to test how an object moves on different surfaces and used our knowledge of magnets to design and make a game.

Class 4

Class 4 have looked at 2D shape this week and have listed their properties. We used terms such as horizontal, vertical, parallel, right angle and quadrilateral. In science we grouped animals using different classification keys and in theme we looked at stone age houses and compared them to homes today. We continued with *Stone Age Boy* and discussed how the characters are feeling and what they are thinking.

Another excellent week.

Class 5

This week in Class 5 we have finished presenting our wanted posters and have taken on the role of Beowulf to write a diary entry thinking about how he would have felt once he was left waiting in the Meadhall for Grendel; knowing that all of the Danes were hoping and praying that Beowulf would be successful. In maths we have been identifying different types of angles and have begun using a protractor to measure acute and obtuse angles accurately. In Theme we have looked at two Anglo-Saxon kings in details; King Alfred the Great and King Athelstan. We looked at what they both did during their reign and carried out a debate to argue our reasons for why we thought one king was more successful than the other.

Class 6

This week we have been learning about multiples, prime numbers and factors in maths. In English we have nearly finished the first part of our book this term: Beowulf where Grendel is defeated by Beowulf.


In theme we have been writing notes in which we will debate over who is better: King Alfred the great or King Athelstan. In science we have been learning about microorganisms and we have done an experiment on which environment makes mould grow faster; which involved wiping bread on toilet seats and window frames! In SMSC we did posters on calming techniques; in RE talked about what is faith and how it helps people get through the hard times. In PE we practiced our rugby skills that we learnt last week.
























Do you use Amazon?


