<u>Class R</u>

This week class R have been finishing looking at Pirates. We have created our own gold coins out of salt dough and written some excellent Pirate stories, using the features of narrative. The children have really enjoyed learning different sea shanties,

in Music, and making up actions to them and trying to play them on the instruments. On Friday we had a football theme to

our challenges and the children enjoyed been creative and designing their own footballs and football shirts. In SMSC, we talked about what makes a good friend and the children were able to tell each other why they made good friends. Finally in

Phonics, we have been practicing our red words and the children have done some excellent reading with red words.

<u>Class 1</u>

This week in English we have been working on suffixes. We added er, est, ing and ed to see how this changes the meaning of the words. We have also started to write our own riddles about African animals. In Maths we have been completing assessments in multiplication and division and addition and subtraction. In Theme we recapped on what we had learnt about the Maasai people of Kenya and considered how our lives compare to theirs. In PE we were lucky with the weather and managed to get out in the sun to practise our jumping skills. We learnt to jump from one foot to two feet and from two feet to two feet using our arms to propel ourselves. We thought about which style of jump helped us jump higher and which helped us jump further.

We have really enjoyed our Football Friday today especially our penalty shoot out!

<u>Class 2</u>

This week in our Theme and English lessons, Year 2 have read a story called 'Lila and the secret of rain'. The story is set in Kenya and is about a little girl who tries to bring the rain to save her village. We have used the story to help us improve and up-level our writing. We have written descriptive noun phrases, learned how to write an exclamatory sentence and how to use a thesaurus to

improve our vocabulary. In our RE lesson we researched inspirational people from different faiths to find out more

about their lives and why people think they are inspirational. In Maths we have focused on problem solving this week. We have had to use our reasoning and resilience skills to help. We have worked with pattern, symmetry, shape, position and direction. In this week's lifestyles lesson we talked about our emotions and how we can feel at different times and in different situations. We also practised paying a compliment to others, it made us happy to give a compliment as well as receive one. We also made a rainbow fruit platter, feel good food to boost your mood!.

<u>Class 3</u>

This week we have continued our book 'Bewilderwood' looking for verbs which describe ways of moving and then finding more using a thesaurus. We have written descriptions for how they could have crossed the Broken

We have used our reasoning skills in Maths to solve problems and enjoyed sketching wood in art using the sketching pencils. We had a great time controlling the robots in ICT when we recreated the England match against our Denmark 'cone' team!

Class 4

We have been solving two-step word problems in maths this week. The class have learnt to highlight key information before attempting to work out the answer. In English we have written diary entries and answered some comprehension question as we continue to read *Bewilderwood.* We had a 'big fat science quiz' to see what we could remember from all of the past year's learning. In theme we have sketched a witch's face and in PE we continued with athletics.

<u>Class 5</u>


