<u>Class R</u>

This week in Class R we have been very busy indeed. In literacy we have continued our topic on travel, discussing different forms of transport from the past, present and future. We made horse headbands to reflect the past and worked in groups to create a carriage using different materials from the outdoor area. We also made a time machine and acted out travelling to

the past in front of our classmates. We used our super imaginations to design our own forms of futuristic transport. In phonics we recapped some of our set 2 sounds including ir, ou and oy. In PE we went on an Easter egg hunt, racing to find beanbags under cones. In numeracy we learnt about the number nine. We used our fingers to show how many we needed to make nine. We found 9 items of things in the classroom and even formed the number nine with our bodies on the carpet. In RE we shared our knowledge and understanding of the Easter Story, talking to our partners and then retelling it to each other as a class. The children were amazing, remembering key people and terms including Judas and Peter and how they betrayed Jesus. As well as special terms such as the Last Supper/Passover and why it was called this. We also made our own Easter Sunday wheel. To end our week of fun we performed the Bunny Cokey Song with actions, Old MacDonald's Easter Farm and Five Easter Eggs in the Sweet Shop.

<u>Class 1</u>

This week in English we have created a story map to help us remember the order of events then we have retold the story a section at a time using pictures from the story to help us. We have tried very hard to remember the three important things in our sentences- capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We have also tried to include as many details form the story as we could remember. In Maths this week we have been learning about position, directions and turns. We have used positional language such as above, below, next to, between, in front of, behind, inside, outside, left and right to describe the position of objects. We have also used guarter, half, three guarter and full to describe turns. We practised turning our bodies through these different turns. In Theme we have been learning about Neil Armstrong and how be became the first man to walk on the moon. We found out that it took him 3 days to get to the moon. We have also enjoyed meeting the chicks this week, they were very cute.

<u>Class 2</u>

In writing, we have been retelling the story of Jack and the Beanstalk using vocabulary and spelling rules that have been taught this term. In maths we have found out about simple equivalent fractions of shapes and numbers. However, by far the highlight of the week has been Forest School. Class two have smiled, laughed and shown resilience through sun, hail, snow and rain. We have had a competition to find out which team could build the tallest beanstalk, made Little Red Riding Hood's cottage, retold Jack and the Beanstalk using natural objects and made a number line in tens and ones using sticks. On Friday we built dens and had a well earned relax sitting next to the Forest School fire! It really has been a fantastic week!

Class 3

This week, Class 3 have been busy rehearsing their songs and poems for their upcoming performance. We have been working hard on pace, voices and expression and we are improving every day. In maths, we have had a challenging unit learning about 12 /24 hour clocks and digital. We are going to continue with this next week. We have also been polishing our multiplication knowledge on TTRockstars as well as taking part in the class round of the DLP Spelling Bee which has given us practice at spelling out loud rather than writing down our spellings. This is new to the children and I am really proud of how hard they tried.

Class 4

Class 4 have looked at lines of symmetry in maths this week. We created difficult patterns for our partners to recreate along a line of symmetry. We also practised drawing symmetrical shapes. We completed the big spelling test in English and we looked at global warming in SMSC. For theme we focussed on the colosseum and gladiators. We completed a challenge booklet and took part in a fun board game. In our PE on Thursday, we continued our unit by using elements of 'follow-the-leader' and 'freeze-frame' in our Roman-inspired dances. We also spent more time practising for our performance next week. It's nearly there!

<u>Class 5</u>

This week in Maths we have been reading and interpreting data presented on Line Graphs. In English we have been concentrating on reading our class text and had been checking our understanding by answering a range of comprehension and inference questions. In Science we have been producing bar charts to show the different gestation periods of a range of animals. In Theme we have been focusing on locating different cities in the UK and have been planning how far it is between the different cities and how much slapdust (how Badlanders travel in our class text) we might need to get to the different cities.

Class 6

This week in Class 6 in maths we have been answering a range of reasoning problems based around place value and have worked hard to convert fractions, decimals and percentage and to find percentages of numbers. In English we have written a description of the Dedalo from our class text 'The Girl of Ink and Stars;' thinking carefully about the different writing features we need to include. In Science we have looked at how light is reflected and also tried to make periscopes and then explain how they work so that we are able to see through them.

City In The Community - Lifestyles

Class 6 had their last lifestyles session with Monique from CITC this week, where they made fajitas. Each week the children have worked with Monique to create a range of healthy snacks including; pancakes, overnight oats , smoothies and tortilla pizzas. The children have created the meals themselves and have learnt how having a varied diet can promote a healthy lifestyle. They have also learnt about the importance of hygiene when handling and preparing food.

Parent Pay

Please make sure your child's Dinner Money and BASC fees are up to date before we break for Easter. School is carrying more debt than usual at the moment, and as financial pressures increase for us all, it is important you do not let your debts with school increase.

Those with unacceptable debts in dinner money and BASC remaining after Easter will be asked to provide packed lunches or find alternative childcare until the debts are cleared.

Please consider using the auto top-up function in Parent Pay for dinner money - this enables you to set an automatic payment of an amount you set to be triggered when the account balance gets to a specific point, meaning you don't get in debt.

Music fees for Autumn and Spring should now be paid, leaving just the Summer term fees - the summer term is due straight after Easter.

For children to continue learning an instrument next year, all current year fees must be paid in full.
